



## Hosting an EAL Canada EAPD Coach Course

Thank you for your inquiry into hosting an EAL Canada Workshop. We are delighted to be able to provide workshops in many locations, and have conducted EAPD Coach Courses and Clinics across Canada.

So, what is needed to host a workshop?

There must be a minimum of five participants. Participants must be over the age of 18 years. Class sizes range from 5 – 12 participants. We keep the classes small to facilitate greater learning opportunities and more one-to-one coaching. In addition, Alumni from past courses are encouraged to return for some of the days to provide insight into the exercises, relate stories of their work, and to be refreshed and invigorated as they learn new skills and meet new counterparts.

The following is a breakdown of what EAL Canada will provide and what the host will provide to ensure a successful course.

**COVID and EAPD Courses:** The host will ensure the protocols established by their province are followed. Everyone who attends the course will sign a waiver regarding COVID symptoms. Classes may be smaller unless the host has sufficient room to allow 6 feet between participants both in the classroom and during time with the horses

### What the Host will Supply

#### Facility

- An arena or barn area covered and able to allow up to 5 horses and 12 – 18 people to move around with freedom. A covered round-pen or similar size is sufficient.
- Classroom space with the ability to use PowerPoint and for participants to be able to write in a workbook. Also where people can eat lunch.
- Sufficient washroom facilities for 12-18 people.

## Horses

- A minimum of 5 bomb proof horses that can be sat on bareback. There is minimal riding, but some exercises are enhanced by sitting on the horse.

## Equipment

- Cones, barrels, pylons, etc. that can be used when working through scenarios in the hands-on portion of the course.
- Helmets for those participating in a mounted exercises.

## Food

- Coffee/tea and water
- Muffins/pastries/donuts in the morning
- Lunch (EAL Canada will determine any allergies, preferences, etc. and advise the host). Catered, take-out food or prepared by the host. Note: we continue discussions through lunch so it must be available on the premises.

## **What EAL Canada will Supply**

- One participant spot at a significantly reduced rate. This is to offset the cost for use of the facility.
- A per diem for each participant, trainer and alumni attending to cover the cost of food.
- Posters for distribution.
- Advertising
- All materials related to the course, workbooks, handouts etc.
- In depth classroom teaching
- Demonstrations related to EAPD
- Instruction and opportunity for participants to do hands-on work with the horses
- Certificates of Achievement upon successful course completion
- On-going follow-up through social media, alumni group, and additional material and information.
