

### **SCORING**

Contestants received points throughout the six weeks of pre-pageant preparation and will earn additional points pageant night in a variety of categories. Pre-pageant points comprise 70% of the total possible points while pageant-night points comprise 30%. All points are computed into the total that determines the final results and crowning of the 2016 Miss Oak Harbor and Teen Miss Oak Harbor Royalty. Pre-pageant points were earned in the categories of Academics, Attendance, Interview, Physical Fitness, Promotion, Service and Work. Pageant-night points are awarded for Stage Presence, Speech or Talent and Formal Wear.

### COMPETITION CATEGORIES & AWARDS

All contestants (grades 9-12) participate in the same 6-week program and are scored using identical models. However, 9th- and 10th-graders compete only against each other in Speech/Talent and for the titles of Teen Miss Scholar and Teen Miss Oak Harbor, while 11th- and 12th-graders compete only against each other in Speech/Talent and for the titles of Miss Scholar and Miss Oak Harbor. In addition to crowns, sashes and trophies, many other exclusive prizes will also be awarded.






