We see yellow school buses practice their routes even now as thousands of Georgia's children begin to head back to school. As theologians, we must ask ourselves what kind of school they are returning to. One of the largest school system in Georgia recently approved the purchase of security screening and weapons detection equipment to be installed on campuses this school year. A systematic implementation of these Evolv systems will roll out next week in Gwinnett County Public Schools in which three schools per week will have two screeners installed onsite. These screeners, along with the clear book bag pilot that took place last year are but symptoms of the cultural sickness currently resulting in school place violence and vulnerability.

Minister Donnie Bell, Sr. and Pastor Thomas Luke recently created a podcast worthy interview on a Christian Perspective of Patriotism in America. The inspiration came from an sermon Pastor Luke recently preached which was sparked by a student's lack of knowledge of the Pledge of Allegiance. As a former enlisted man, Pastor Luke felt a heart tug to minister the truth about the lack of unity in these United States. Rather than a political message, Minister Bell highlighted that this message about patriotism is a spiritual issue. By obeying God, they share, we can submit ourselves to authority according to 1 Peter. In leaning toward an understanding that God is He who places people in authority, we can stay clear of idolatry in patriotism. The ministers brought to awareness that love is at the heart of God's call, however, the cancer of hate is prevalent in our families and communities. This interview leans into the theme of this year's CAPT Conference which is scheduled for this October.

# Rev. Willie J. Webb



Webb was employed for 13 years with Management Training Corporation and the Atlanta Job Corps Center as a Trainee Employee Assistance Program Specialist. He provided alcohol and drug education for staff and students and was tasked with providing drug testing, substance abuse addiction classes, tobacco and prevention programs, drug awareness, and counseling and support services for thousands of Job Corps students. He also policies and procedures wrote administering effective trainee employee programs for a healthy assistance workplace. That work greatly influenced the writing of Hatred Addiction Recovery (2018) and Healing for Hatred Addiction (2024). Rev. Willie James Webb has written a dozen books aimed at recovery of the heart broken by hatred.

Healing For Hatred Addiction defines, explores, illustrates and analyzes the nature and the human destructiveness of hatred as an acquired contagious addictive illness that poses a lethal threat to human life and society, itself. This book informs and illustrates the insidious pervasiveness of the toxic, deadly influence and effects of hatred as a spiritual illness; impacting individual health and security and the total wellbeing of society. It also has good news that emphasizes possibilities for prevention, control, treatment, recovery and the elimination of hatred. Hatred Addiction Recovery provides through education, methods and means to overcome an omnibus global threat to human life, known as hatred. Hatred is a total loser. It hates not only the hated, it hates self as the hater.
