

Trusting God When We Don't Have All the Answers

Last night at church, the Scripture chosen was **Proverbs 3:5–6**:

“Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths.”

The message centered on what it means to keep trusting God even when life feels complicated, unclear, or difficult to explain.

As we grow in faith, we begin to understand that walking with Christ also means learning how to walk with trust. None of us has all the answers. Theology can be difficult, life can be heavy, and every person may connect with Christ in a slightly different way. But Proverbs reminds us that God does not ask us to understand everything before we trust Him. He asks us to acknowledge Him, lean on Him, and allow Him to direct our path.

Many of us have walked through seasons where we asked, “Why?” Why did this happen? Why didn’t that prayer get answered the way I hoped? Why is this taking so long? Sometimes those questions have answers, and sometimes they don’t.

That can be frustrating because we naturally want to understand what God is doing. We want the roadmap before we take the journey. Yet faith often calls us to take the next step before we can see the whole path.

Someone in the congregation mentioned that even from a secular perspective, people who love science recognize that the human mind cannot comprehend everything. Albert Einstein often expressed wonder at the limits of human understanding. That observation connects beautifully with the biblical principle that we are not God. We are not meant to carry the burden of knowing everything. Some things remain mysteries, and that is okay.

The song choice, Brandon Heath's "That's Enough," tied the entire message together. The song reminds us that God's presence is enough. We do not have to understand every situation, explain every hardship, or have every answer in order to rest in Him.

Sometimes we spend so much energy searching for explanations that we forget the comfort of simply knowing God is with us.

When life is uncertain, His presence is enough.

When prayers seem delayed, His presence is enough.

When we cannot see what lies ahead, His presence is enough.

The simple truth is that God is here, God loves us, and God is good.

The message was a reminder that faith does not require us to have every answer. Faith invites us to trust the One who does.

At the end of the day, life may be complicated, but God is still present. God is still good. And we can continue walking with Him one step at a time, trusting that He will direct our path.
