Petition in Support of "Labor Against Conquest"

Whereas, workers everywhere share a common interest in peace and stability, and conflict threatens livelihoods, human rights, and the ability of labor communities to organize freely;

Whereas, the United Nations Charter and General Assembly Resolution 3314 (1974) define aggression to include "the use of armed force by a State against the sovereignty, territorial integrity, or political independence of another State";

Whereas, any annexation or invasion by the United States of a sovereign nation, particularly Canada or Mexico, or any other act that meets the UN definition of aggression, would disproportionately harm working families and undermine the principles of international solidarity;

Whereas, it is our moral and civic duty as workers to stand against all forms of unwarranted aggression and to deploy our collective power in defense of peace and human rights;

We, the undersigned, support and endorse the adoption of a resolution that:

- Condemns Aggression
 Declares the use of military force for the purpose of annexation or invasion to be an intolerable and unjust act that violates international law and the fundamental principles of peace.
- Establishes a Strike Trigger
 Commits our union, labor organization, or labor community to a democratic vote to enact a strike (or work stoppage) in the event that the United States government undertakes any act constituting aggression under UN definitions.
- Demands Accountability and Transparency
 Calls upon our elected representatives and government officials to adhere strictly to international norms, respect the sovereignty of other nations, and engage only in diplomatic or lawful actions.
- Fosters Solidarity Across Borders
 Encourages partnerships and solidarity with workers in other countries—especially those directly threatened—to oppose aggression and to advocate for peaceful conflict resolution.
- Protects the Rights of Workers
 Ensures that workers who engage in collective action are supported by strike funds, legal resources, and a network of community allies.
