\$50.00 goes to Wyoming County Planning Commission, along with a copy of the map and application. \$50.00 goes to the township to cover expenses. \$20.00 per lot (No more than 4 lots) to cover expenses.

- ****Subdivision maps should be in the office 2 weeks prior to the Township Planning Commission meeting. Also, the Planning Commission has 60 days to review before making a decision.
