What is the Digital Library?

The FamilySearch Digital Library comprises books owned and digitized by the FamilySearch Library, along with public domain books digitized by various libraries and genealogy societies across the United States and Canada. The project is now expanding to include international collections, with new materials being identified and scanned in countries such as Norway, the United Kingdom, Germany, and France. Currently, the collection boasts over 600,000 items in more than 100 languages. This unique collection not only provides essential names, dates, and places related to ancestors but also includes stories, pictures, and historical context.
