What are lineage societies?

Lineage societies and first family programs were established to honor sets of people that are significant in the history of our country and the individual state and territories as our country grew.

Many of the first societies were based on military service. After the centennial celebration in 1876, more people were eager to prove their patriotism and societies such as the National Daughters of the American Revolution and the General Society of Mayflower Descendants were formed.

Today there are over 300 of these types of societies ready for you to explore and join if you qualify.

There are also certificate programs that are run by state or local historical societies where an individual can honor an early Pioneer settler to a certain location. The application process is very similar to the larger lineage societies however there is no further involvement once approved other than having your ancestor on their records.

General Guidelines for Application Process

STEP 1 – Create a family tree at least 6 generations on paper or in software program

STEP 2 – Gather copies of vital documents (birth and death certificates, marriage records, census records, baptisms, wills, bible records)

STEP 3 – Complete application form following guidelines

STEP 4 – Redline and cite documents to assist the reviewer

STEP 5 – Scan copy of EVERYTHING for your records

STEP 6 – Enclose payment and mail to address provided (some offer online submissions and digital payment)

STEP 7 – Share your acceptance with other family and friends after approval
