Kansas City is a thriving metropolitan area located in the American heartland with a colorful history, wonderful places to research, and a plethora of museums. From steamboats to wagon trails to jazz and sports, opportunities for historic and specialized research abound.

Geography

- Located in the middle of the United States on the Kansas-Missouri border at the junction of the Kansas (aka Kaw) and Missouri Rivers in both Kansas and Missouri
- Three Kansas Cities: KCMO, KCK, and NKC
- Kansas City area is comprised of six counties:
 - Wyandotte and Johnson in Kansas
 - o Jackson, Cass, Clay, and Platte in Missouri

History

- Native American Tribes Kansa, Missouri and Osage
- Trappers, traders and explorers records of Spain & France
- Part of the Louisiana Purchase
- Lewis and Clark explored the area
- Trails Westward:
 - o Santa Fe Trail opened in 1821
 - o Oregon Trail in 1843
 - o California Trail, gold rush in 1849
- Pre-Civil War immigrants from France, Germany, and Ireland
- Americans from the South including slaves
- Mormons from the East and Northeast
- An Area Rich in Conflict:
 - Mormon Wars
 - Border Wars
 - o Civil War

- Post Civil War immigrants Germans from Russia, Greeks, Italians, Poles, Russians, Scandinavians, and Eastern European Jews
- More recent immigrants Chinese, Filipinos, Indians, Mexicans, Polynesians, and Vietnamese

Records

- Missouri & Kansas have different record access
- State Census Records
 - o Kansas 1855-1925, every 10 years
 - o Missouri 1840-1876, every 4 years, none survive for Kansas City
- Courts & Naturalization Records
 - District of Kansas
 - Western District of Missouri
 - Not restricted to state of residence
 - Jackson County has two county courts
- Newspapers check both states
 - Kansas State Historical Society free access from website
 - State Historical Society of Missouri branch at UMKC
- FamilySearch Images & Film
 - o Kansas only eastern-most counties, includes KC area
 - Missouri all counties
