
HDC CODE OF CONSUMER RIGHTS

Right 2 Right to freedom from discrimination, coercion, harassment, and exploitation.

Right 6 Right to be fully informed.

Right 7 Right to make an informed choice and give informed consent.

NZ BILL OF RIGHTS

Right 10 Right not to be subjected to medical or scientific experimentation.

Right 11 Right to refuse to undergo medical treatment.

 MUST ACKNOWLEDGE THE BENEFITS BUT ALSO ANY RISKS AND ALTERNATIVES.

 IT MUST BE FREE FROM COERCION AND THE THREAT OF BEING DENIED OUR RIGHTS TO WORK AS MIDWIVES.

Aku Huia Kaimanawa Midwives Collective

- Over 300 midwives got together to raise concerns about the mandates.
- We took a case to the high court.
- We never stopped fighting injustice.
- Heartbreaking to see our numbers drop as midwives took the jabs to keep food on the table.
- Over 200 midwives were mandated out of practice; less than half have returned. Some lost their homes.
 Some were prosecuted. All were ridiculed and ostracised because they stood up for human rights.
