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Jesus took away, abolished, condemned, & destroyed sin in our flesh and nailed it to the cross!



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INTRODUCTION

Addressing this subject is fundamentally important to our belief system. The production of an overcoming faith is based on true knowledge. The information in these seven parts will build our true knowledge and belief systems. We're dealing here with the removal of legalistic requirements, sin, sickness, and demonic oppression, as well as with the sources of power to abolish them. These biblical truths are revealed and supported to help you know and understand that Jesus has taken all of humanities sin and sin nature. That is a big deal, but what does it really mean for you? We will see.

Awareness

Science has identified that if a person does not know to look for something (because of unawareness), they will not find it, even if it is available to them. Inattentional blindness has been documented by many college studies. It is also known as perceptual blindness.

Awareness and the practice of knowledge are keys to success. Deception and blindness are two components Satan uses to steal, kill and destroy. These Q and A's offer very critical essentials. Those who are hungry for answers and solutions and then pay attention and persevere are the ones who find the truth. There are 6 verses that identify ignorance in the New Testament. Maybe it was an issue God wanted to make sure got covered. Here is the list:

- 1. For I do not want you to be ignorant of the fact... 1 Corinthians 10:1
- 2. I do not want you to be ignorant of this mystery, brothers and sisters... Romans 11:25
- 3. But we do not want you to be ignorant, brothers... 1 Thessalonians 4:13
- 4. But concerning spiritual manifestations, I do not wish you to be ignorant... 1 Corinthians 12:1
- 5. For we do not want you to be ignorant, brothers... 2 Corinthians 1:8
- 6. But I do not wish you to be ignorant, brethren... Romans 1:13
- "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge. Because you have rejected knowledge, I also will reject you from being My priest. Since you have forgotten the law of your God, I also will forget your children." (Hosea 4:6),

PART 1 - DID JESUS TAKE AWAY SIN, SICKNESS AND INFIRMITIES?

Forecasted

- Surely our griefs **He Himself bore, And our sorrows He carried**; Yet we ourselves esteemed Him stricken, Smitten of God, and afflicted. But He was pierced through for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities; The chastening for our well-being fell upon Him, And by His scourging we are healed. (Isaiah 53:4,5, NASB).
- Bless the LORD, O my soul, And forget none of His benefits; Who pardons all your iniquities; Who heals all your diseases; Who redeems
- "And she will bear a Son; and you shall call His name Jesus, for it is **He who will save His people** from their sins." (Matthew 1:21, NASB).

Fulfilled

- And when evening had come, they brought to Him many who were demon-possessed; and He cast out the spirits with a word, and healed all who were ill in order that what was spoken through Isaiah the prophet might be fulfilled, saying, "HE HIMSELF TOOK OUR INFIRMITIES, AND CARRIED AWAY OUR DISEASES." (Matthew 8:16,17, NASB).
- And you know that **He appeared in order to take away sins**; and in Him there is no sin. (1 Jn 3:5, NASB).
- The Son of God appeared for this purpose, that **He might destroy the works of the devil**. (1 Jn 3:8, NASB).
- and **He Himself bore our sins in His body on the cross**, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness; for by His wounds you were healed. (1 Peter 2:24, NASB).
- He personally bore our sins in His [own] body on the tree [as on an altar and offered Himself on it], that we might die (cease to exist) to sin and live to righteousness. By His wounds you have been healed. (1 Peter 2:24, AMB).
- He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him. (2 Corinthians 5:21, NASB).
- Otherwise, He would have needed to suffer often since the foundation of the world; but **now once at** the consummation of the ages He has been manifested to put away sin by the sacrifice of Himself. (Hebrews 9:26, NASB).
- so Christ also, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, shall appear a second time for salvation without reference to sin, to those who eagerly await Him. (Hebrews 9:28, NASB).
- 'And now why do you delay? Arise, and be baptized, and wash away your sins, calling on His name.' (Acts 22:16, NASB).
- your life from the pit; Who crowns you with lovingkindness and compassion; (Psalms 103:2-4, NASB).

Recap of Jesus fulfilling the cancelation of sin sickness, infirmities, etc.

- 1. Jesus will save His people from their sins
- 2. Jesus, Himself, took our infirmities, and carried away our diseases.
- 3. Jesus appeared in order to take away sins
- 4. Jesus appeared for this purpose, that He might destroy the works of the devil
- 5. Jesus Himself personally bore our sins in His body on the cross
- 6. By Jesus' wounds humanity has been healed
- 7. Jesus has been manifested to put away sin by the sacrifice of Himself
- 8. Jesus was offered once to bear the sins of many

Commentary

What does it mean; "at the consummation of the ages He has been manifested to put away sin by the sacrifice of Himself"? Jesus once for all, at the consummation and close of the ages, put away and abolished sin, by His own sacrifice. He absorbed it into His blood and poured it on the Mercy Seat. Suffice it to report that Jesus did take away the sins of the world. The evidence is overwhelming, therefore should be a relevant factor to base our belief on.

PART 2 - DID JESUS' BLOOD PURIFY CHRISTIANS FROM ALL SIN?

- but if we walk in the light as He Himself is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin. (1 John 1:7, NASB).
- He gave Himself for us to redeem us from all lawlessness and to purify for Himself a people for His own possession, zealous for good deeds. (Titus 2:14)
- just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many." (Matthew 20:28)

Recap of effect of Jesus' purification

- 1. the blood of Jesus His Son <u>cleanses us from all sin</u>. (1 John 1:7, NASB).
- 2. to <u>purify for Himself a people</u> for His own possession, zealous for good deeds. (Titus 2:14)
- 3. to give His life as a ransom for many." (Matthew 20:28)

Commentary

Jesus, the Apostle John, and the Apostle Paul confirm that Jesus gave His life (nobody took it), to cleanse and purify us from all sin. That should confirm the question, His blood did purify us from all sin. This purification is the basis for propitiation, an atonement sacrifice, by Jesus, required to reconcile God directly to mankind. This is THE KEY ELEMENT for our salvation! This is also why nobody can go to God without going through Jesus. The point that the only way to God is through Jesus is not a blockage to God. It is an open doorway. It is God who sent Jesus to clear out the sin obstacle so God could be reconciled to man. It was Jesus Whose sacrifice absorbed that sin blockage and expended it on the Mercy Seat to opened the door for humanity!

PART 3 - DID GOD ABOLISH AND CONDEMN SIN IN THE FLESH?

- by <u>abolishing in His flesh</u> the <u>enmity</u>, which is the Law of commandments contained in ordinances, that in Himself <u>He might make the two into one new man</u>, thus establishing peace, (Ephesians 2:15, NASB).
- For what the Law could not do, weak as it was through the flesh, God did: sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and as an offering for sin, <u>He condemned sin in the flesh</u>, (Romans 8:3, NASB).
- For the law of the Spirit of life [which is] in Christ Jesus [the law of our new being] has freed me from the law of sin and of death. God has done what the Law could not do, [its power] being weakened by the flesh [the entire nature of man without the Holy Spirit]. Sending His own Son in the guise of sinful flesh and as an offering for sin, [God] condemned sin in the flesh subdued, overcame, deprived it of its power over all who accept that sacrifice], (Romans 8:2, AMB).
- knowing this, that our old self was crucified with Him, that our body of sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves to sin; for he who has died is freed from sin. (Romans 6:6,7, NASB).

PART 4 - DID JESUS SET CHRISTIANS FREE FROM THE LAW?

- For the law of the Spirit of life in <u>Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death</u>. (Rom 8:2,).
- For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes. (Romans 10:4, NASB).
- for the Law brings about wrath, but where there is no law, neither is there violation. (Romans 4:15, NASB).

Recap of God abolishing and condemning sin and the law

- 1. Jesus abolished sin and law in His own flesh so He could create a new form of humanity, Christianity
- 2. God sent Jesus, as an offering for sin, and He condemned sin in the flesh,
- 3. God did what the Law could not do, condemned sin in the flesh, and deprived it of its power over all
- 4. Saints old self was crucified with Jesus, that our body of sin might be done away with,
- 5. Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death.
- 6. Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes.
- 7. where there is no law, neither is there violation.

Commentary

Something had to give. The law was not working. The Sanhedrin had misused the Jewish system and corrupted it beyond repair. So God sent Jesus. But what could He do? Even armed with all authority from heaven the Sanhedrin wasn't going to let anyone "Elbow-In on their turf". God was experienced with "start overs", as evidence of Noah. But this time God was going to redeem humanity, but was restricted because of sin. So as Jesus abolished sin and law in His own flesh then He could create a new form of humanity, and we call it Christianity. In discarding the clergy laity system God went direct to humanity, no middle man, no mediator, no covering. That is why He condemned sin and law. Now where there is no law there is no transgression (Rom 4:15), and Christ is the end of the law for believers. (Rom 10:4). When we enter into Christianity, we leave the law and shift into grace, bypassing death, wrath, and transgressions! This is not a license to sin. If anyone continues sinning it is an indication that they need to repent, or that they "missed the mark" and are still a sinner, and need to convert to Christianity.

PART 5 – DID JESUS DISARM RULERS, FORGIVE TRANSGRESSIONS AND CANCELED DEBT?

- And when you were dead in your transgressions and the uncircumcision of your flesh, He made you alive together with Him, having <u>forgiven us all our transgressions</u>, having <u>canceled out the certificate of debt</u> consisting of decrees against us and which was hostile to us; and <u>He has taken it out of the way</u>, having <u>nailed it to the cross</u>. When <u>He had disarmed the rulers and authorities</u>, He made a public display of them, having triumphed over them through Him. (Colossians 2:13-15, NASB).
- I am writing to you, little children, because <u>your sins are forgiven you for His name's sake</u>. (1 Jn 2:12, NASB).

Recap of Jesus disarming the evil empire!

- 1. God made you to be alive together with Him, and has forgiven all your transgressions,
- 2. God canceled out all sin debt that was withholding you from a direct relationship to Him.
- 3. Jesus disarmed the rulers and authorities, especially those who will try to control you
- 4. Your sins are forgiven because of Jesus, and His propitiation sacrifice

Commentary

This is important that we establish how Jesus disarmed the enemy and how He took heavenly standards and values and awarded those keys to anyone who selects Him and His salvation sanctuary offering. Once we know that God sent Jesus to forgive our sins and cancel our debt, then when some religious leader tries to identify you as a sinner, and place you as an underling below him (a hireling), you know they are false teachers and need to avoid that relationship. You know that Jesus disarmed sin and forgave you and accepted you at your word when you confessed Him as Lord and Savior. This is part of His taking our sin and our sin nature, and replacing it with His righteousness He is supplying us from heaven.

PART 6 - DID JESUS CHANGE CHRISTIANS' SIN NATURE?

- "Instead of the thorn bush the cypress will come up; And instead of the nettle the myrtle will come up; And it will be a memorial to the LORD, For an everlasting sign which will not be cut off." (Isaiah 55:13, NASB).
- <u>Instead of the thorn shall come up the cypress tree</u>, and <u>instead of the brier shall come up the myrtle tree</u>; and it shall be to the Lord for a name of renown, for an everlasting sign [of jubilant exaltation] and memorial [to His praise], which shall not be cut off. (Isaiah 55:13, AMB).
- So you'll go out in joy, <u>you'll be led into a whole and complete life</u>. The mountains and hills will lead the parade, bursting with song. All the trees of the forest will join the procession, exuberant with applause. <u>No more thistles, but giant sequoias, no more thornbushes, but stately pines</u>—Monuments to me, to God, living and lasting evidence of God." (Isaiah 55:12-13, Message).
- "And you are in Him, made full and having come to fullness of life [in Christ you too are filled with the Godhead–Father, Son and Holy Spirit–and reach full spiritual stature]. And He is the Head of all rule and authority [of every angelic principality and power]." (Colossians 2:10 AMPC)

Recap of Jesus changing sin nature

- 1. Instead of the thorn bush the cypress will come up; instead of the brier shall come up the myrtle tree;
- 2. You'll be led into a whole and complete life.
- 3. No more thistles, but giant sequoias, no more thorn-bushes, but stately pines
- 4. All Saints are now in Jesus, made complete and having come to a fullness of Zöe life. We are reconciled to God and filled with God.

Commentary

There is a shift from carnal to divine nature and there are many aspects in how to discuss it. I am submitting this short chart and sequence that illustrates interesting shifts from carnal to divine. Our stages of growth for prayer effectiveness is based on the fundamental truths taught by Jesus.

| Illumination, Awareness | Awareness leads to truth and knowledge |

| Revelation, Acknowledgment | Acknowledging information yields to revelation which can build our belief system |
| Inspiration, Activation | Belief system inspires & activates the substance of faith |

Best results are due to abiding in and exerting Jesus' keys.

- 3 Stages of success from working with Holy Spirit and His faith:
- 1. ILLUMINATION: Light does break darkness and ignorance & then awareness builds truth and knowledge
- 2. REVELATION: Knowledge leads to becoming a knower (not doubting), being committed and realizing you can become a doer (overcomer), and replicate Jesus' works
- 3. INSPIRATION: Belief leads to activation, doing the natural and supernatural works

PART 7 – DID JESUS CHANGE CHRISTIANS' NATURES AND REMOVE THE EFFECTS OF SIN?

This has always been a great question so I want to review it as clearly as I know how. It is important that each of us get a truthful review of just how effective Jesus completed His Works.

Sincere repentance does erase judgement and it does provide avoidance of the consequences of sin, or a personal a sinful track record. *Once again, sin is the problem and Jesus is the solution!*

The objective to sincere repentance is to enter into salvation, to leave a sinner status and to enter Christianity, a new form of humanity, as a saint, initiating our eternal life on earth before entering heaven. This transition confirms our dying to sin and sinful activities, which means we have joined into Jesus' own cruxifixction and the benefits thereof. As we grow in Christianity, our divine nature is developed, to fulfill our earthly destiny.

The benefits of a real salvation are many. Regarding judgement, because we are at one with Jesus, Who is sinless then so are we. Because we have embraced salvation, and denied a sinful lifestyle, saints have bypassed judgement and death, meaning upon completion of our earthly life we instantly are with Jesus in Heaven. Saints new eternal and abundant life are in Jesus.

Forecasted

• Then the eyes of the blind will be opened, And the ears of the deaf will be unstopped. Then the lame will leap like a deer, And the tongue of the dumb will shout for joy. For waters will break forth in the wilderness And streams in the Arabah. And the scorched land will become a pool, And the thirsty ground springs of water; In the haunt of jackals, its resting place, Grass becomes reeds and rushes. And a highway will be there, a roadway, And it will be called the Highway of Holiness. The unclean will not travel on it, But it will be for him who walks that way, And fools will not wander on it. No lion will be there, Nor will any vicious beast go up on it; These will not be found there. But the redeemed will walk there, And the ransomed of the LORD will return, And come with joyful shouting to Zion, With everlasting joy upon their heads. They will find gladness and joy, And sorrow and sighing will flee away. (Isaiah 35:5-10, NASB).

God Has Removed Sin And It's Effects

- He has removed our sins as far from us as the east is from the west. (Psalm 103:12)
- "Lo, for my own welfare I had great bitterness; It is You who has kept my soul from the pit of nothingness, For You have cast all my sins behind Your back. (Isaiah 38:17)
- "I, even I, am the one who wipes out your transgressions for My own sake, And I will not remember your sins. (Isaiah 43:25)
- 'For behold, the stone that I have set before Joshua; on one stone are seven eyes. Behold, I will engrave an inscription on it,' declares the LORD of hosts, 'and I will remove the iniquity of that land in one day. (Zach 3:9)

Fulfilled:

- The blind receive their sight and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed (by healing) and the deaf hear, the dead are raised up and the poor have good news (the Gospel) preached to them. [Isa. 35:5, 6; 61:1.] (Matt 11:5)
- For by these He has bestowed on us His precious and magnificent promises [of inexpressible value], so that by them **you may escape from the immoral freedom** that is in the world because of disreputable desire, and become **sharers of the divine nature.** (2 Peter 1:4)
- Otherwise, He would have had to suffer repeatedly since the foundation of the world. But now He has appeared once for all at the end of the ages to do away with sin by the sacrifice of Himself. (Heb 9:26)

Once and for all Jesus' completely did away with sin for all those who accept salvation!

Open Repentance And Benefits

- Then David said to Nathan, "I have sinned against the LORD." And Nathan said to David, "The LORD also has taken away your sin; you shall not die. (2 Sam 12:13)
- I acknowledged my sin to You, And my iniquity I did not hide; I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the LORD"; And You forgave the guilt of my sin. Selah. (Psalm 32:5)

Two Important Salvation Responsibility Questions

- 1. Regarding salvation responsibilities, the big question for every saints is, are we going to enter into Him, recalibrate our thinking, and renew our standards to become more like God?
- 2. Will we become aware of necessary responsibilities by regenerating ourselves to heavenly standards, and our actions to magnify His light on earth to help reconcile humanity to God?

Recap of Jesus removes effects of sin Forecasted

- 1. the eyes of the blind will be opened
- 2. the ears of the deaf will be unstopped
- 3. the lame will leap like a deer
- 4. tongue of the dumb will shout for joy

Fulfilled

- 1. the blind receive their sight
- 2. the lame walk
- 3. lepers are cleansed
- 4. the deaf hear

- 5. the dead are raised up
- 6. the poor have the Gospel preached to them

Commentary

With the conclusion that Jesus absorbed and removed the law and sin it would seem obvious that He also removed all the effects of our sin and our sin nature as well. If God is granting us humans eternal life in heaven with Him then that demonstrates that Jesus removed sins effects. You know you can't get into heaven with sin or as a sinner. So in knowing the truth of Jesus accomplishments, you cannot be duped, and will be set free to grow in God.

Nobody can be both sinner and saint, or on the narrow and wide road together, so you can't either be in the carnal nature and the divine nature. The law and grace don't coexist and nor do these.

This subject is important to me because I want my spiritual foundation built on unwavering, solid rock, factual truth. That is an issue that impacts my belief system, my faith, and the results of my faith exertion. They are all related. These truths do effect all who are entering into a Godly relationship and want to utilize the benefits of what God has made available.
