


To set priorities after a discussion or a brainstorm.

Steps in the process

- 1. Divide the participants into small groups of 4-8 people.
- 2. Give each group a piece of flip chart paper and some post-it notes/sticky notes.
- 3. Ask each group to draw a boxed, diamond shaped figure on their flip chart paper so it looks similar to the figure below.
- 4. Ask each group to choose the nine most important issues that were discussed and prioritise them according to importance.
- 5. They can post the post-its/sticky notes on the squares provided, with the most important one on top, then the next two in importance until they've ranked all nine.
