The reporter skillfully addressed a seemingly small but important question—what dredge actually is ensuring clarity for the audience. This piece exemplifies a broader, recurring story: communities resisting environmental changes imposed in the name of economic development. Great use of sound to enhance storytelling, particularly in the introduction of a key stakeholder. The ambient sounds of waves and children on the beach created an immersive scene, effectively transitioning from a broad perspective to the personal impact on local families. Additionally, Carlos was a strong choice as a voice advocating for both the community's right to enjoy natural beauty and the environmental concerns at stake. The question of incorporating a dredging facility into the park is particularly striking, reinforcing the complexity of the issue.
