

CAPBA PRESIDENT APPOINTS 3 NEW DIRECTORS

The Chesapeake AP Broadcasters Association welcomes three new members to the Board of Directors this month. Newly appointed by CAPBA President Jeff Wade of WBAL Radio are Carolyn Presutti of Voice of America, Washington, D.C.; Robert Lang of WBAL Radio, Baltimore; and Nathan Hager of Bloomberg News, Washington, D.C. Presutti and Lang both are returning members to the CAPBA board, and previously served as president of the organization during their earlier terms. Presutti is chairing the group's Auction Committee, which raises funds for a \$3,000 annual scholarship for a college or university student pursuing a degree in broadcast journalism.

Lang is chair of the Scholarship Committee, which reviews applications that are submitted in the spring to select a recipient for the annual award. Lang and Hager also are members of the Awards & Contest Committee, which oversees the annual competition to recognize the best journalistic work submitted by stations in the region.

This year's annual Awards Banquet and Convention will be held at the Hilton Garden Inn in Ocean City, Md., May 31 through June 2, 2024.
