
Photos with Santa Sat., Nov. 27, 1 to 3pm Whitepine Grange

"What's growing on?" (News from the Oct. 26 meeting)



The October meeting was held Tuesday, Oct 26, at

7pm and was well attended, with 19 Grange members present (plus one small Shihtzu belonging to Bill Beck).

Our guest for the well attended meeting was Preston Wenz, superintendent of Trout Creek School District. He spoke about the new garden project



they've begun at the school, and ways the community can help it along. The garden, he says, will have a dual purpose: first, it will teach kids about gardening, growing things, and even possibly the business side of selling their produce. It will also supplement the food available for the school lunch program.

Steve Cobb, member of Whitepine Grange, queried whether the garden would be the sustainable variety which would produce seeds for subsequent years of plantings. Cobb and several other Grangers expressed interest in getting involved, and the membership passed a resolution to step in, as Whitepine Grange #102, and help out wherever we could. After all, the Grange is


about growing things, particularly for its local citizenry!

In other business at the October 26 meeting, the membership approved its first-ever set of by-laws, which will now be sent to the State Grange and Secretary of State for their

records. Since the early days, Whitepine Grange has operated without its own by-laws and simply followed the Montana State Grange by-laws. Now we have our own, which will serve as a guiding beacon to light our way forward as a healthy organization.

Jan Manning, Whitepine Grange president, reported on the Montana State Grange Convention she attended last month in Hamilton. Highlights of the State Convention are mentioned in her account on page 5.

The Grange also voted to adopt an anonymous needy family for Christmas and provide them with specific gifts they need and desire. The "Christmas family" program is sponsored by Sanders County Coalition for Families (SCCFF). By early November, SCCFF will have a family for us to shop for this Christmas. We will know clothing sizes for each family member and then can go out and shop for these items Presents should not be wrapped. All presents will be delivered to SCCFF, which will do the wrapping and delivering. If you've ever thought it would be fun to be a "secret Santa," here is your chance. Stay tuned for more details.



We also voted to resume the "Words for Thirds" project, which purchases dictionaries for all third-graders in our area. "Words for Thirds" has been a long-standing annual Grange project throughout the U.S. for years. Since its inception several decades ago, Granges like Whitepine have donated nearly two million elementary-level dictionaries to individual third-graders. Whitepine will partner with Thompson Falls Grange, sharing costs, to service schools in the west end of the county. Page 4
