Whitepine neighbors turn out for flagpole dedication

It was a cold, blustery morning, but about 30 friends, neighbors and Whitepine Grange supporters came to the dedication of the Grange's first flagpole.

The event was Nov. 11, 2022—Veterans Day and many of the participants were veterans, including members of the Thompson Falls American Legion Post.

Festivities began inside, with the Trout Creek School Choir singing the National Anthem, led by director Alicia Wenz. Carolyn Nesbitt, Grange vice-president, then paid tribute to the flag and the volunteers who made the flagpole happening.

Whitepine Grange was chartered in 1938 and originally met at the Whitepine School (which burned down in the early '60s). The present Whitepine Grange building was constructed in 1961. Now, six decades later, the Grange finally has its own flagpole.

The 32-foot larch pole was locally harvested and prepared by Grange volunteers Don Manning, Monte Nesbitt and Tim Greene.

A solar light mounted at the top of the pole ensures that Old Glory can fly 24 hours a day for decades to come. Visible from the highway, it's a beautiful sight!

Grange membership gives us rural folks an identity...a peer group that bonds us together and protects us from isolation that can lead to depression and even suicide. Did you know suicide is more prevalent in rural areas? We can change that by continuing to *reach out* and *draw in* our neighbors, and the Grange is the perfect magnet. It's a hub for all of us.



Our Whitepine Grange bylaws stipulate that we elect new officers every two years, so the officers elected last year still have one more year to serve in their current positions. The only exception to that is the Executive Committee, which consists of three members, one of whom must be replaced each year.

The Executive Committee's job is to help manage Grange business between the monthly Grange meetings. This includes decision-making (.i.e., which bid to accept on a major remodel project); crisis intervention (i.e., what to do if the water pipes freeze up) and scrutinizing the Grange's books and records. It's an important "on call" job.

Grange scholarship apps are due by February 23!

The Montana State Grange has scholarship money available for high school seniors and GED grads to continue their education in

college or certified trade schools. The application for applying is Feb. 23.

Applicants need not be Grange members, but must meet other criteria including a 2.5-point grade point average. The applicant must be



a high school graduate or have an equivalent GED at the time the scholarship is paid. At the time the scholarship is paid, the applicant must be enrolled as a full-time student (based on the educational institution's definition of full-time for under-graduate or graduate studies). Proof of registration must be provided at the actual time of the scholarship payment.

For complete judging criteria and an official application form, email Jan Manning at whitepinegrange@gmail.com. Remember that applications must be sent to the Montana State Grange secretary in Helena and postmarked by Feb. 23.




Fitness classes expand with new evening rebounding class

It's called a "rebounder" and, according to medical and fitness professionals, it can work miracles. Whitepine Grange will be offering a six-week class in "rebounding," meeting Thursday evenings at 5:30pm beginning Jan. 12.

A rebounder is a mini-trampoline. Working out on a rebounder is like child's play with many benefits. Besides burning calories, the rebounder can also strengthen the immune system and detoxify lymph nodes. It's low impact, so it's safe for anyone with joint issues. It helps build bone mass and muscle while improving posture and balance.

Each class session lasts 45 minutes and will incorporate warm-up, cool-down and light stretching. Light weights will also be available to enhance your rebounder workout.

Advance registration is required . Class size is limited to six students. Fee is \$30 for the six weeks. To register, contact instructor Jan Manning at sandersagility@gmail.com.
