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Northwest Farm Credit Services awards grant to WPG

The Whitepine Grange hall will be much cozier next winter, thanks to a generous grant from Northwest Farm Credit Services.

The grant will help pay for blown-in insulation in the Grange attic, bringing the insulation factor to near R60.

Tyson Reese, manager of Missoula's NWFCS office, said, "I am so please to be able to help out the community of Trout Creek." NWFCS has a history of helping rural communities and nonprofit organizations with funding for basic needs that support improvement projects.

"We are so honored to have this gift from NWFCS," says Jan Manning, Whitepine Grange president and secretary of "Friends of Whitepine Grange," which is the 501.c.3 branch of

Whitepine Grange. "This is going to improve the comfort level astronomically, so we can hold more community events with much lower heating costs."

Cottrell Construction will be doing the insulation job as soon as possible. The blown-in insulation will be supplemented with some rolled insulation donated by Grange members Monte and Carolyn Nesbitt.

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Mushroom ID class draws eclectic audience



The Western Montana Mycological Association, in cooperation with the MSU Extension Office in Sanders County, presented a "Mushroom ID" class at the Grange on May 25.



Turnout was excellent for the event, which brought people from throughout the northwest who were taking part in a "mushroom foray" camping experience that weekend outside Thompson Falls. Class participants got to see and touch a variety of mushrooms found in this area. The Mycological Association is based in Missoula.

Experts estimate there are more than 11,000 species of mushrooms in North America!

- Insulate the attic. We now have the funds, and it will happen prior to fall.
- Move furnace to the basement for less noise and efficiency. Will include additional ductwork.(Est. \$3k)
- Purchase and install new vinyl planking over the old original particle board flooring in main room. (Est. \$12k)
- Improve and landscape the grounds for outdoor recreation and picnics. Involves clearing, leveling, rolling, seeding, and addition of picnic tables and/or a pavilion and barbecue. (Est. \$22k)
- Purchase and install an on-demand hot water heater to replace the old tank heater in the basement. (Est. \$2k)
