Information Sheet

1. Rehearsals- Rehearsals will take place every Monday (and Tuesdays as required) from 6:00PM until 8:30PM beginning on Monday February 20th 2023 until June 13th 2023. Tech Week begins Saturday June 17th until Monday June 19th – there will be several rehearsal throughout this week, schedule TBD (will be released at first rehearsal). Participants are asked to bring: Indoor shoes, their script and a pencil (not pens), water and a snack for break (granola bar, piece of fruit ect- a list of allergies will be compiled and circulated once the cast is formed). Rehearsals will be held in Hanmer at Le Club D'age D'or on Cote Blvd. **Attendance for all rehearsals and performances is mandatory- unless you're sick.**

2. Show Info: The show performance schedule is as follows: Performances are nightly @ 6:30 PM on Thursday, Friday, Saturday June 22-24th; with matinees on Saturday and Sunday the 23rd and 24th at 3PM. There will be school matinee performances on Tuesday and Wednesday June 20th and 21st - we will do two performances per day for these matinee days (bring a lunch!). Performers should arrive 1hr before showtime in order to prepare. Tickets for the performances will be \$15 per person general admission. Will be available through the website or with cash at rehearsals. Tickets are general admission, meaning seating is first-come, first-serve. Doors will open one half hour before the performance.

3. What to Expect? Aside from the show, children will be learning exercises to help them work on their talents, from acting to singing and dancing. These “warm-up” classes will feature techniques and exercises to help them hone their craft. Once rehearsals begin, we will be working on all kinds of things, like: singing in harmony, learning dance routines, acting, making props and costumes, and all the different parts that come together to put on a show. The program is free to enroll and open to all children from 6-18 years old.

4. What to expect at rehearsals. Rehearsals are the place where the work gets done. Work always gets done better/faster/easier when everyone is attentive, cooperative and above all QUIET unless performing. This will be SO important especially with such a big cast. We will not tolerate being disrespected by children when they're told to settle down/ be quiet/ listen – they will simply be removed from the number. We value our time and we love having fun with kids, but won't tolerate sass. Save the drama for the stage, kids.

Don't forget to bring:

- Any lyrics sheets, scripts ect that you've been given
- Indoor shoes and clothing you can move in! (track suits, tshirts- this isn't a fashion runway)
- Water and a snack for break. (No one has advised of any allergies that would limit snacks. Will communicate if this changes).
- Your biggest smile, your can-do attitude and your willingness to try!

5. Rehearse at home! The best performers practice their craft daily! We will send you audio files, videos and all sorts of aids to help you practice at home, it's up to you to put the work in and shine!
