The ability to weep with those who weep is necessary for true healing." -Jemar Tisby, The Color of Compromise

So much has happened over the past months; our lives, our communities, and our world has been turned on its head in more ways than one. So many difficult trials have bombarded even those of us who are the most isolated from the effects of the turmoil of our time. Our grief is heavy, and the weight of our world is hard to bear. Yet, amid all this I have seen sparks of hope and glimpses of God's renewing work appear right within the life of our community of faith here at Holy Trinity.

We continue to gather digitally and in small, socially distanced groups 'to love and serve all' in the name of Christ our Lord! We take hope in the truth that 'Nothing can ever separate us from the love of God' even while we grieve our losses and face the trials of this time. I have been inspired and empowered by the bold acts of faith that I continue to experience each day as people work together to come up with amazing responses to the hardships of our time. Communities as well as individuals have found ways to care for and connect with others sharing the burdens that we all bear. I pray that you have found joy in these responses as well and have experienced a relief of some of your own burdens.

With courage, tenacity, humility, and trust in Christ, I have seen people not turn away from the exceedingly difficult issues that face us in this time. One example of that which I pray continues to grow and transform all our lives and our communities (of faith or otherwise), is the fight for racial equality and justice that has risen up since the death of George Floyd earlier this year. Movements such as Black Lives Matter have for so long called out the injustices that our siblings of color experience due to the broken systems, structures, and relationships in our world and nation. Yet, these calls have gone mostly unanswered and the cries of those who have deeply suffered at the hands of racism continue to be silenced or ignored by the wider population.

We all are suffering in this time, to one degree or another: health struggles, financial hardship, natural disaster, grieving the loss of a loved one, and so much more. Yet, it cannot be denied that those who already were facing hardship prior to the pandemic are being disproportionately affected by the chaos brought on by COVID-19. We must as people of faith cry out Lord have mercy, Christ have mercy- not only for ourselves in our despair, but especially for our siblings of color who face suffering that is compounded by the death dealing forces of racism.

Our prayers for God's healing, deliverance, and reconciliation give us hope and comfort, but also lead us to action. What is God leading us to in this time as we so desperately yearn for healing? It has been both challenging and encouraging to take part in the online adult forum's conversation surrounding the sin of racism over these past few months. There is so much that can lay claim to our attention nowadays, and rightly so- there are so many important issues we face in this pivotal moment in history. Yet the call for racial justice and equality is not one-of-the-many conversations that need our focus, but instead is of utmost importance for our nation and for all our lives. What we do in this moment to address this issue will decide our very future. That is why we continue the conversation in our community to see where God is leading us to in this work.

The Church has led the charge in many civil rights movements over the years. This is only right as the call to witness to Christ is the call to witness to the very image of God that all people bear within their own bodies. We as the body of Christ have fought successfully in this calling to social justice over time, but there is still so much more that can be done. The way of Christ that is the path to true healing is both an eternal gift and continual calling in our lives. May we continue to travel this path together and see where Christ is leading us dear siblings in Christ. We can trust that God's kin-dom is already breaking into our world through the work of Christ. Let us take joy in the ways in which the Holy Spirit gifts each of us to take part in this kin-dom work each day and experience the grace and healing that come through God's love made present in and through us all!



Some of our members like working behind the scenes but here in the office we noticed and we are grateful!



FINANCIAL SNAPSHOT

YTD INCOME\$ 377,466.29(Regular/Pledged giving \$258,504.0192% of budget)(Special Projects Giving transfers\$ 32,625.96)(PPP Funds for HTLC Staff Payroll\$59,188.49)

YTD EXPENSES \$349,267.65 (includes budgeted expenses and special projects)

YTD Net Surplus/(Shortfall) \$28,198.64



The Stewardship Team, council and pastors continue to be amazed by the generosity of this congregation. Regular/Pledged Giving remains over 92% compared to budget, despite all worship and ministries being done online and through new and creative ways. Members provided over \$46,000 to support the upgrades to the telephone and internet infrastructure throughout the building and audio & sound system upgrades in the sanctuary. Neither of these projects were anticipated and included in the budget for 2020 but the needs were met – amazing!

The Finance Team is meeting soon and will take a look at how the 2020 budgeted expenses may be adjusted due to the extended closure, and how that may affect the budget shortfall we planned for at the Annual Meeting. Watch for more information in the next Tidings.
