SPOTLIGHT ON QUILT, KIT, AND PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRIES!



Did you know?

Since April, Lutheran World Relief has been distributing quilts and kits at six centers for displaced Ukrainians, sheltering families fleeing bombs, violence and uncertainty. In addition, they are subsidizing the cost of emergency housing for more than 15,000 people. Most arrive with only the clothing on their backs, so providing these families with food

and essential supplies like folding beds, pillows, heaters, laundry detergent and personal hygiene items is of the utmost importance. Your quilts and kits are a ministry of love to families in Ukraine.

In February, 161 students at Isede Primary School in Tanzania received LWR School Kits. Not only did the kits provide pencils and notebooks they need to continue their education, but student attendance also improved significantly because they had the supplies they needed. By U.S. standards, the value of a school kit is around \$20, but the value of a school kit is priceless for these children, thanks to your love.

We are collecting items for Personal Care kits in the month of October. Lutheran World Relief provides us a wonderful opportunity to reach out to our neighbors around the world. Thank you for your donations and participation!

God's Word, Our Story

Listen my people,
mark each word.
I begin with a story,

Trinity Kids welcomes the whole family to an intergenerational biblical storytelling series we're calling, "God's Word, Our Story." Starting on September 25th, each Sunday from 9:45-10:15 we will gather in the Library to spread the storytelling blanket, open the Bible, sing, and enter the story of God's creative love and mending mercy. Then we'll join our hands in a project (art, activity, or act of service) that responds to the story and involves participants in the life of the church. All ages are warmly welcomed!

This model of sharing the Word with children is inspired by the Godly Play and Catechesis of the Good Shepherd curriculums but is not a direct product of either one. After hearing a Bible story told by heart, children are invited to wonder aloud about what they heard and experienced. This model is rooted in our trust that:

- God is already active and present in the lives of children;
- When we gather around the Word, the living God promises to meet us and speak to us:
- Children are capable of hearing, wondering about, and being formed by Scripture;
- Children experience the God's Word as a story to which they belong when their hearts and imaginations are engaged and when the story is told by caring community members.

Ordinary Time, Advent, and Christmas Seasons 2022

This fall, we begin with stories from the Old and New Testaments about the ancestors of Jesus and the prophets that prepared the way for him. Each week, following the story, we will place a card representing that ancestor on our "Story Tree." During Advent and Christmas, we will heighten our anticipation and celebration by focusing on those who testified to and witnessed Jesus' birth.


