### **ADVENT & CHRISTMAS**

"In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. 9Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. 10But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: 11to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord." - (Luke 2:9-11, NRSV)

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ,

I cannot believe we are entering into the season of Advent, and Christmas is upon us. It feels as if Easter was yesterday and now we are entering into the season of anticipation and preparation of Christ's coming into this world. Although my anxiety rises a little knowing how much needs to get done before Christmas Day, I truly love this time of the year. Decorating the inside and outside of the house with beautiful lights, garland, poinsettias, Christmas trees, and all the holiday traditional decorations that come out only once a year. However, this holiday season is going to be different than in previous years. With COVID still wreaking chaos and heartache in our community and world, we still have to take precautions to protect each other and those in our community. Instead of gathering in person to sing Marty Haugen's "Holden Evening Prayer," we will gather online and sing in our homes as the service is live-streamed on Wednesday's at 7:00 P.M. Instead of the tradition of gathering our families together and frantically trying to get everyone to church on time for the Christmas Eve service, this year our Christmas Eve worship service will only be live-streamed at 7:00 P.M. Although our worship services will be the same traditional candlelight service, this year will be different as we safely gather in our homes for worship. Yet, although I am beyond disappointed with the need to cancel in-person worship, as I am sure many of you are, I lean on the meaning of this season even more in times such as these. During Advent, we prepare for and anticipate the coming of Christ. We remember the longing of Jews for a Messiah and our longing for and need for, forgiveness, salvation, and a new beginning. Advent is a journey to the manger and on Christmas Day we all will look upon the infant child who is named Emmanuel, God with us.

This is the power of this season. Knowing that God has come to us in Jesus...and was born. As simple as this may sound, this is the ultimate act of becoming human. 
