The Synod has given us some names. Personnel is pursuing these leads and will update us as information is available.

PULPIT SUPPLY:

Many thanks to Pastor Jason Davis who has agreed to serve pulpit supply again for the month of December. He will be with us for Advent and Christmas services as well!

CALL TEAM NOTES:

Our initial meeting was held on Sunday, November 13, 2022 from 3:00-5:20 p.m.

Bishop Jones took us through the process of a Call, including completion of a Ministry Site Profile.

Interesting stats: 33 congregations are presently looking for an interim; 3 interims are available in the synod; 650 pastors are retiring per year and either 204 or 240 are being ordained each year.

CONFIDENTIALITY was stressed. Potential interviewee's names are not to be discussed outside of the committee.

We concluded with the hope of having a completed and approved Ministry Site Profile in six months; and with a goal of interviews taking place in the Spring of 2023 (depending on availability of candidates).

John Chesterman will be the chairman of the Call Committee; Sue Tigges will be the secretary/recorder of the Call Committee.

What is Altar Guild? – in simple terms, the Altar Guild prepares the place for the Eucharistic celebration. We are following Christ's directive (Luke 22: 7-13) to go ahead to find a place to prepare the Passover meal. We check candle oil, linens, prepare the cups of wine and plates of bread, and put out the proper paraments for the Church Season and of course, do laundry as needed. It's not difficult to perform these tasks.

We have 6 very faithful volunteers and one more just joined. We could use 5 more people to assist us. That would mean we'd only have to volunteer for one month a year! That's only 4-5 Sundays, depending on the month! We try to schedule members with months they will be available (avoid vacations) and we all act as backup when that sudden change of plans occurs. Mission Statement

- a warm bed on a cold night.

Description

In November of 2011, the Dubuque Rescue Mission issued a cry for help. As the weather grew cold, more men arrived nightly than there were beds available. Could one of the downtown churches possibly help?

St. John's Lutheran Church, a small congregation with a sizable building, answered that call.

"The Guest House at St. John's" officially opened on December 2, 2011. What was anticipated to be only a couple of beds every week or so became 450 beds provided by April 6, 2012. When fire codes threatened the permanent closure of St. John's, the community rallied to provide financial assistance, materials and labor to ensure the Guest House would again open its doors. With the updates complete, the Guest House officially reopened on January 21, 2013 and sheltered five men that same night. By May 1, 2013, the Guest House had provided over 250 beds.

Following on this success, the Guest House at St. John's is currently planning for its future and how it may serve other under met needs for shelter in Dubuque, including the possibility of sheltering men with children and entire families.

St. John's Lutheran Church, led by Pastor Jay Ilten, is not a wealthy church but has nevertheless made a conscious decision to "bloom where (they) are planted" and serve the needs of the people in downtown Dubuque.




Moving here from southern Illinois in the mid 70's I encountered a beautiful landscape of rolling hills, much different than the flat farm land I knew. The beauty of it, gave me a new appreciation of God's wonderful creation and the joy of spending time in nature.

Over the 29+ years that I have worked in the church office I have seen a lot of change, Pastors have come and gone as well as other staff members. Duties have changed, we have gone from doing things manually to 3 different software management programs and countless council changes. Through all the changes I have been blessed to be a part of and to serve this community.
