"I wish it need not have happened in my time," said Frodo. "So do I," said Gandalf, "and so do all who live to see such times. But that is not for them to decide. All we have to decide is what to do with the time that is given us."

J.R.R. Tolkien, The Fellowship of the Ring

Greetings Beloveds,

Just the other day I was reminded of this oft-quoted dialogue from the fantasy book series, *The Lord of the Rings*, written by J.R.R. Tolkien. This quote comes from a conversation between two characters as they discuss the very difficult and unfortunate series of events that they have experienced in their travels together. They are sitting in a very dark cave and the situation they have found themselves in seems bleak. The trials ahead of them on their journey truly look insurmountable, and Frodo is confiding in Gandalf that he feels as if all hope is lost.

In Gandalf's response we hear the lament of Frodo being held tenderly and validated. Yet, Gandalf does not stop there but rather tries to turn his friend's perspective towards a sense of hope and empowerment. It is as if we hear the author asking us as readers, "What will you do with the time given you?" This dialogue between to fictional characters hits close to home given our current situation.

We find ourselves in a situation we wish would "not have happened in our time." I do not know about you, but the weight of the reality we are in right now is almost too much to bear. In times such as these the grief, trauma, and loss that people are experiencing is wreaking havoc on our relationships and our lives. Fear, anxiety, and stress can overwhelm a person at any given moment. A lot is out of our control, and we feel helpless.

Yet, if we think about it, much of what happens to us in life is out of our control. At any given moment, tragedy can befall us in life. We could have never expected such widespread and life-encompassing hardship. It is right and good for us to grieve in this time and to share our burdens with one another. Yet, it is also good for us to encourage one another and to help each other to do the best we can in the time we find ourselves in.

God has given to us agency in life, and we have the power to decide how we will respond to what we are going through. The late Viktor Frankl, an Austrian psychiatrist as well as a Holocaust survivor, wrote "When we are no longer able to change a situation, we are challenged to change ourselves." We, as communities of faith, have been challenged to change in this time in order to protect the health of all. We are also being challenged to change how we think about being the body of Christ and about how we live out our faith each day.

In what ways shall we respond to this crisis as people and as communities of faith? What will we do with the time that is given to us? Will we close the doors to our buildings and the doors to our hearts of faith as well? Will the bells of our churches stop ringing on Sunday and the voices of our proclamation fall silent as well? NO, and you have proven this to be true siblings in Christ! As witnesses to the risen Christ, we are called to proclaim the good news that the powers of sin, death, and the devil have no power over our lives. You have continued to make Christ's presence known to one another and to many others as well. I have witnessed firsthand so many acts of love, compassion, and faithful living in this time. People are choosing to respond with love and hope and are not allowing fear and hate to control them.

There is still hope to be had, and I pray that you may experience this hope in your life. Dear siblings in Christ, be of good courage and know that God is with you in all this. We have a living God who is active and working to bring about new life in all times and all places. May you and yours experience new life in this time, and may you give witness to this new life in the world.

AN UPDATE FROM COUNCIL

As many of you know, the federal government has allocated more than \$350 billion to assist small businesses, including non-profits such as our congregation, in keeping employees on the payroll and covering critical expenses through this trying financial time. The CARES Act created the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP), providing loans/grants through the Small Business Administration with provisions for loan forgiveness of up to 100%, depending upon how the loan funds are spent. This is unprecedented – a church receiving funds from the SBA!

BACKGROUND: By electronic vote on April 2nd, your church council authorized the Council President to apply for this forgivable loan/grant. Therefore, on April 3rd, Sue Tigges submitted a Paycheck Protection Program Application Form to Premier Bank (an SBA-approved bank). April 3rd was the earliest date that companies (including churches) could apply but from review of their program, time was of the essence as money applied for was being granted on a first-come, first-served basis. On April 8th, a representative from Premier Bank advised Sue that the "loan" had to close within 10 days of application. On April 10th, Sue Tigges (as Pres) and Adam Eikamp (as V-P) signed the necessary paperwork at Premier Bank. On April 13th, the sum of \$91,500.00 was deposited into HTLC's designated checking account.

USE OF FUNDS: These funds are only to be used for payroll costs and utilities for a two-month period. We are tracking this and in June, I will be applying for forgiveness. Loan forgiveness will be proportionally reduced if we decrease our full- time employee headcount OR decrease salaries and wages by more than 25%. So at this time, we do not know what amount, if any, will need to be refunded. In the end though, this has protected our church and Noah's Ark staff at the present time.

PLEASE remember that the financial strain that we may feel isn't necessarily right now but may occur later in the year. We still need your financial support now more than ever. We now have necessary expenses that are not in our budget for computer, internet and live streaming capabilities, all of which we initially thought was for a future purchase and have instead found is an immediate need. So please, keep Holy Trinity in your prayers.

PLEASE consider signing up for automatic giving (check out our website at <u>www.htldbq.com</u> for more information). It is a great way for you and your family to make the personal commitment that your gift is a priority and constant focus.

In conclusion, I want you to know that I really miss seeing my church family and especially miss worshiping in our church space but also know that we are lucky to have pastors (and office staff) that have taken us to the next level of virtual prayer! Prayers to you all, for health, patience, and understanding in this time of need!

ROCK ISLAND CAMPING TRIP


Sunday, July 5th - Saturday, July 11th 2020 Open to Middle School & High School Students

The mission of the Dubuque Food Pantry is to make food available to needy people in the Tri-State Area. Clients are referred to the Pantry by churches and religious organizations, public and private service agencies, and by members of the Board of Directors. The client then receives food and various other items at the Food Pantry, located at 1598 Jackson Street. The food pantry is open MWF afternoons and Tuesday mornings.

The monthly food distributions that we host and participate in are another way we help feed the needy in our community. This helps for only a short time each month.

During the current Covid-19 pandemic many families are struggling to have enough food, especially with no classes or breakfasts/lunches at their schools. The food pantry is overrun and even with additional funds from emergency sources can't supply all who are in need. They were unable to have one of their major food drives, Scouting for Food, because of the need for social distancing.

The best way to help the food pantry is by financial gifts as the food pantry can purchase needed items cheaper than most of us can. Use the yellow special appeal May envelope for this purpose. For those who have gardens, the food pantry can always use fresh produce in season.

The Little Food Pantry and Blessing Cabinet is still open and available to our community. This is a vital ministry, especially now.

If you are making a large contribution, please call Pastor Derek. He will bring it inside the church building to add to our stores of food.


