The truth is, the church has never closed, only the building in which the church gathers to worship our risen Lord Jesus Christ. We are the church. As disciples of Jesus, who is the head of the church, the church lives within us and we are entrusted to carry out Christ's mission as described in Matthew 28:18-20, "And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.'" The Church is an active, breathing, moving force living within the world.

And I have seen the Church in action here in Dubuque, in Iowa, across the nation and around the world. Yet here we are, living in a technological world sharing the message of God's love in Jesus Christ online with people not just locally, but around the world.

Yet this does not mean I do not miss seeing you all at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church. I miss you. I miss hearing your laughter, hearing your stories, seeing you tease one another. But I know we will gather together again. When? I honestly do not know. We are waiting for a decline in people testing positive both here in Dubuque and in the state of Iowa. Once we see that decline start, and continue over a 28-day period, we will begin to slowly start worshiping together in person at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church. Your council truly is amazing and filled with individuals who closely monitor the finances to ensure the future of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church as well as the active COVID-19 cases in the city and state to make the decisions that will keep you all and the staff safe. We may not like the decision to remain closed, I know I don't, but I also know that as long as it's made to keep everyone safe...then it's the right decision.

So let us continue to be the Church for one another. Let us continue to carry out Christ's mission to "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." Let us continue to serve one another, share Christ love with everyone, and gather online to worship the one who has freed us from the bondage of death and given us new life, Jesus Christ our Lord. ## A NOTE FROM YOUR COUNCIL PRESIDENT

Hello to all Holy Trinity Lutheran Church members,

Throughout the past several weeks I have heard a lot of positive feedback about our on-line church services. As you know, this was forced upon us because of the COVID-19 pandemic. I do want to point out that I am especially proud of both Pastor Josh and Pastor Derek for taking on this task - it has been very stressful and frustrating at times, but they are now computer geeks. Please know that it has not been an easy transition - there has been a lot of cobbling of equipment taking place, a huge learning curve, purchase of new computers, mini sound board, cords, etc. in order to be able to live stream.

Since we first started live streaming the worship services we have found that the services have provided a much needed ministry for our community and throughout the world. We have seen various people joining us for worship; members who have moved away, churches in Guyana, individuals in the community without a church, and even more significant is that our shut-ins have been able to sign on and worship with us. Several of our shut-ins have stated they feel even more a part of our community now than they did before with the dvd recordings. Pastor Josh has even received emails from individuals asking to join the church because of the online worship services. This is the new norm congregations are going to be living into and we pray HTLC will be able to live into this new future as well.

Our next step though is our need to bring our current 20-year-old video and audio equipment up to date. This has been on our radar for awhile but now is the time to take that step, which would allow streaming and offer quality on-line services. The current sound system is not compatible to provide clean and clear sound for live streaming. Although many of you have voiced the desire to continue to live stream when the pandemic is over, we simply cannot do so without updating our sound and video system.

At our May 19, 2020 Council Meeting, your Council reviewed and approved a new Lifeline system at a cost of approx. \$28,000.00. The equipment being purchased is attractive because of the ease of use, the versatility of presets and the expansion options. This system will allow HTLC to continue to grow into the future. Pastor Josh has contacted several churches and organizations who use the sound system we are looking to purchase and we received nothing but positive reviews.

We are looking forward to offering a better on-line service product for all of our members and nonmembers to enjoy, and we would appreciate your monetary support for this project benefiting our church community. With your support, we can complete this much needed upgrade. Would you consider making a monetary contribution to help us further our mission? Together, we can reach our goal of \$28,000.00. Please know that I am researching grants also to see if there is money available to alleviate the cost of our purchase.

When we tend to our Spirit it grows, we are caring for ourselves. This will help us to face this pandemic with a perspective of gratitude rather than discouragement or depression.

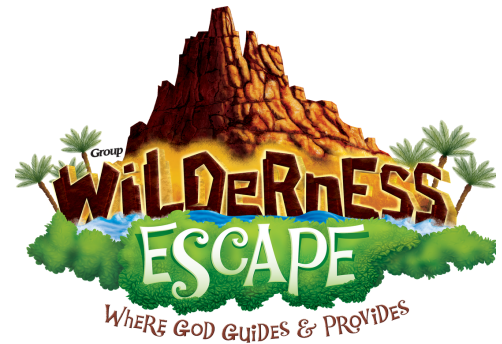

## JUNE SPECIAL APPEAL DUBUQUE RESCUE MISSION

The Dubuque Rescue Mission has been serving Christ in its love and care for our siblings who are poor for the past 81 years plus. The Mission offers overnite shelter for 45 men, provides over 230 meals a day to those seeking food and fellowship, and provides clothing and other material goods to those with no means to pay. They also provide city bus passes for job searches to those they serve and assist in helping to get people back on their feet after hitting hard times.

Christ is at the center of all that the Dubuque Rescue Mission does. The care and love that is shown through the ministry of this organization and all who serve it is an essential resource for the greater Dubuque community. Monetary donations are especially needed in this time as this ministry depends on the generosity of local churches and individuals to maintain it. A great deal of their income would normally have been raised through sales from the Thrift Store that is a part of the Mission's ministry. Making up almost 50% of their funding, the Thrift store being forced to close during this crisis has created a great hole in how they are able to continue to carry out their important work.

During this health pandemic, even more people need the love and support of fine organizations such as the Dubuque Rescue Mission. With the additional economic burdens being experienced during this crisis, there is no shortage of need for food, housing, clothing, and all the other essential services provided by this organization. We ask that in this time, if you are able, you consider giving a financial gift towards this special appeal for the Dubuque Rescue Mission.
