Understanding Technology: CONNECTING TO BLUETOOTH

Bluetooth allows your Phone to connect wirelessly to other devices, like headphones, speakers, or your car, without needing cables. This step-by-step guide will help you connect your Phone to Bluetooth devices quickly and easily.

Step #1: Unlock Your Phone

- 1. **Turn on your Phone** by pressing the power button (usually on the side or top).
- 2. **Unlock** your Phone by swiping up or pressing the home button (if your Phone has one) and entering your passcode, using your fingerprint, or Face ID.

Step #2: Open the Settings App






Look for the **Settings icon** on your home screen. It looks like a gray **gear**. Tap the **Settings icon** to open it.

Step #3: Go to Bluetooth Settings

In the **Settings menu**, find and tap on "**Bluetooth**". It's usually located near the top of the list. Tapping on "**Bluetooth**" will open the Bluetooth settings.

Step #4: Turn On Bluetooth

At the top of the Bluetooth screen, there is a switch next to "Bluetooth". If the switch is gray, Bluetooth is turned off. Tap the switch to turn Bluetooth **ON** (it will turn green when it's on).

Step #5: Turn On and Set Up Your Bluetooth Device

Turn on the Bluetooth device you want to connect, like your wireless headphones or speaker.

- Put the device into **pairing mode**. This is usually done by holding down the power button or another special button on the device (check your device's manual for specific instructions).
- Once your device is in pairing mode, it will be ready to connect to your Phone.

Step #6: Find and Select Your Device

- 1. After turning on Bluetooth, your Phone will automatically search for nearby Bluetooth devices. Under the "Other Devices" section, a list of available Bluetooth devices will appear.
- 2. Find the name of your device (for example, "Headphones" or "Car Audio") in the list.
 - o Check the device for the Bluetooth name to be identified.
 - Tap on the device name to select it.

Step #7: Pair and Connect

- 1. Your Phone will try to pair with the device. Some devices may ask for confirmation or display a code that you need to approve.
 - o Tap "Pair" if prompted.
- 2. Once paired, the status will change to **"Connected"** next to the device name, and you're ready to use the Bluetooth device.

Step #8: Using Your Bluetooth Device

- 1. **If you connected headphones or speakers:** Sound from music, videos, or calls will now come through your Bluetooth device.
- 2. **If you connected to your car**: You can make hands-free calls or play music through your car's sound system.

Turning Bluetooth Off

After you're done using Bluetooth, you can turn it off by going back to **Settings** > **Bluetooth** and tapping the switch to turn it **OFF** (the switch will turn gray).

This helps save your phone's battery when you're not using Bluetooth.

Additional Tips

- Troubleshooting: Make sure your Bluetooth device is charged: A low battery can cause connection issues. Check pairing mode: Ensure your device is in pairing mode (check the manual). Move closer to the device: If you're too far away, the connection might fail. Restart your Phone or Bluetooth device: Turn both off and on, and try connecting again. Forget and Reconnect: In the Bluetooth settings on your Phone, tap next to your device's name, then choose "Forget This Device". Try connecting again by selecting it from the list.
- **Automatic Reconnection**: After pairing, your Phone will automatically reconnect to the Bluetooth device whenever it's in range and Bluetooth is turned on.
- In the Car: Connecting your Phone to your car via Bluetooth allows you to make hands-free calls and listen to music through your car's speakers. Follow the same steps to connect.
