Seizure First Aid

How to help someone having a seizure in a wheelchair

1

STAY with the person until they are awake and alert after the seizure.

- ✓ Time the seizure ✓ Remain calm
- √ Check for medical ID ✓ Check for Seizure Action Plan
- ✓ Rescue medicines can be given if prescribed by a health care professional



2

Keep the person **SAFE**.


- ✓ Keep them in the wheelchair unless you have to move them
- ✓ Use wheelchair lock to keep the wheelchair in place and put seatbelt on loosely to keep them from falling out
- Pad the wheelchair to prevent injury
- ✓ Stand in front of the wheelchair to prevent them from slipping out
- ✓ Move or guide away from harm



3

Turn the person's chin down and to the **SIDE**. Support their head to help keep the airway clear.

✓ If they **can't stay in** the wheelchair safely, call for help and guide them gently to the floor. Turn the person onto their SIDE with their head turned to the side if they are not awake and aware



✓ Put something small and soft under the head



Call **911** if...

- Seizure lasts longer than 5 minutes
- Person does not return to their usual state
- Person is injured, pregnant, or sick
- Repeated seizures
- First time seizure
- Difficulty breathing

Do **NOT**

- X Do **NOT** restrain.
- X Do **NOT** put any objects in their mouth.
