We, the Council want to thank all of you who participated in our recent Congregational Survey. We appreciate your candor and suggestions for improvement.

In a lot of ways, our old Church is a new church. The illness of our previous full-time pastor, Mark Cansino, and the pandemic have had a huge impact on our congregation and its resources. As a result, we are facing many of the same issues and struggles as a new church.

Looking back to 2016, the last year Pastor Mark was with us, we had 263 members. At the end of 2021, we had 136 members, **48% less.** Member giving was \$200,038 in 2016. In 2021, it was \$138,432, nearly **31% less.** These reductions are the result of uncertainty, with several interim pastors following Pastor Mark, the near-complete shutdown due to the pandemic, and the loss of many dear members who have gone home to the Lord.

However, like a new church, we are beginning to see growth. Visitors are finding their way to our door, with 12 becoming new members this year. We do have some advantages over the typical new church. We have a great facility with a Sanctuary, Fellowship Hall, and several offices. We have solar to help with our utility costs. We also have a steady source of income from our Cell Tower.

What we don't have yet is live music from an organist, or a choir. We share your desire to get back to where we were before. Our hope is that over the next few years, we'll continue to grow, increasing our member giving, and will eventually have the resources to add music staff to help us with this. Until then, we'll continue to work on improving our recorded music offerings, returning to communion at the altar rail, and a simple bulletin. We will get back to notifying our congregation with weekly announcements and prayer concerns with phone calls for those in need.

Your faithful partnership has made it possible to work through the challenges of the past and our plans for our future. Please know we are here if you have any questions or concerns.

FINANCIAL REPORT Ending October 31, 2022

a. Offering Envelopes

- i) For the month, significantly under budget at 79.3% (\$9,856 vs \$12,434).
- ii) Year-to-date, on budget at 97.2% (\$105,715 vs \$108,756).

b. Total Income

- i) For the month, under budget at 97.7% (\$14,360 vs \$15,156).
- ii) **Year-to-date,** over budget at 106.2% (\$149,068 vs \$140,353).

c. Expenses

- i) For the month, under budget at 95.4% (\$15,953 vs \$16,727).
- ii) **Year-to-date,** just over budget at 101.6% (\$163,068 vs \$160,499).
- d. Net Operating Income (Total Income minus Expenses)
 - i) For the month, close to expected with a loss of \$1,593 vs the expected loss of \$1,571.
 - ii) **Year-to-date,** much better than expected, with a loss of \$13,999 vs the expected loss of \$20,146.

e. Checking balance

- i) Balance at Month-end is \$10,951.
- ii) Previous Month-end balance was \$12,605.

f. Comments

- i) October was a disappointing month with Member Offerings well below budget. In spite of this, our YTD loss is much lower than projected thus far, due to lower than projected expenses YTD and Memorials designated for our General Fund. If we can hit our Budget Income and Expense numbers in November and December, we may be able to end the year with a loss of \$6-7,000, instead of the projected \$13,000 loss.
- ii) Next year's budget will be more challenging because we will no longer have the \$10,000 from the Campus Ministry fund to augment our income stream.

On-Line / Electronic Giving

Faith Lutheran does not currently offer On-Line giving via our Web Site, for a variety of reasons. BUT, if you find that giving electronically (not having to write a physical check) to be your preferred method of donating to Faith Lutheran, you can always use your bank's Bill Pay service. If you already pay your bills that way, it's easy to add Faith Lutheran to your list of regular payees. Simply add a new payee/vendor (depending on what you bank calls people/companies you pay via Bill Pay) using the following address: FAITH LUTHERAN CHURCH, 28200 PORTSMOUTH DR, MENIFEE, CA 92586. Put your First and Last Name in the "Account Number" field (don't enter your envelope number as the account number, as that can change from year to year).

When you use your bank's Bill Pay service, they will print a physical check and mail it to the church. The Account Number (your First and Last Name) will be on the check, making it easy for us to credit your donations record with your gift. If your check is for something other than your regular offering, just indicate what the check is for in the Memo Line area when you use the Bill Pay service. And, if you give a specific amount each week or month, you can use your Bill Pay service to automatically send that amount to Faith Lutheran, making it even easier!
