


FAITH LUTHERAN CHURCH * JULY 2022

Dear faithful friends and fellow children of God:

We as a church have a tendency to think of stewardship as a once-a-year thing, a stewardship season, or a stewardship drive. But when we really look at the tenants of stewardship, it is something to be studied and applied throughout the year. We also have a tendency to only think of the financial aspect of stewardship, the treasure if you will. But in this letter, we could take an honest look at the stewardship elements of time and talents as well. That is to say, how we give of ourselves not in objects or funds, but of our time spent using our talents to serve one another, expand, and sustain the ministries of the church.



The spirit behind stewardship and of giving of ourselves is really one of giving thanks for what we have been given, gifts from God, choices and abilities that make us unique as individuals, and connected by those unique gifts as children of God. We have much to give thanks for this day even with things we are concerned about mixed in. While the pandemic is still going, we can give thanks that we are at a place where many of our ministries and activities have been able to resume in one way or another and we've even been able to start new ones. Well, we give thanks for the ability to have these ministries again, we encounter the issue addressed in the verses selected from the gospel of Matthew, we have great opportunities and plentiful ones to do ministry in the church, but as we rebuild and regrow the opportunities for ministry are outstripping those who are involved in carrying it out. In other words, the harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. What this means is we have a great small group of volunteers who are already in the harvest but who could really use the company of our fellow faith members to also participate in the implementation of ministries new and old.

We have some volunteers already, but the simple fact is that we need more. The council leadership has tallied it up in approximate numbers and has counted about 60 positions or jobs in the church ministries with about 30 unique people performing those jobs (many of whom do multiples of those jobs) and there are a couple of positions left unfilled.

In order to sustain these different ministries for the long term and prevent burnout and overworking of those taking on many roles already, I'm asking more people to heed the call from the church ministries and get more involved in the ministry of the church. We all benefit from and enjoy these ministries, ministries like worship and music, fellowship, outreach, and of course coffee hour. For this example in particular, I think we are all overjoyed that we have been able to renew the coffee hour and the ministry of fellowship that comes with it. However, coffee hour requires some intentional, not overly physically complicated, volunteers to make it happen. Currently, we have a small and mighty group of folks who have been fulfilling the coffee hour duties, *and* they need *YOUR* help! They'll teach you how to do it, where everything is, and support you in joining the ministry of providing refreshment and fellowship for your fellow Faith members. Put your name on the sign-up sheet or talk with Arlene Dressler for more information.

If you have wondered how you can help with the congregation, what you can do in the church, and how you can be a giving steward of your time, coffee hour is a perfect opportunity to help harvest the gifts God gives us. I encourage you to prayerfully consider signing up with your family, friends, or another group you are involved with.

So, until we see each other again: "May the Lord bless you and keep you; may the Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you; may the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace." (Numbers 6:24-26).

FINANCIAL REPORT Ending May 31, 2022



a. Offering Envelopes

- i) For the month, over budget at 104.8% (\$12,087 vs \$11,533).
- ii) Year-to-date, continues under budget at 95.0% (\$52,614 vs \$55,357).
- b. Total Income
 - i) For the month, over budget at 105.0% (\$14,927 vs \$14,213).
 - ii) Year-to-date, below budget at 95.5% (\$69,560 vs \$72,836).
- c. <u>Expenses</u>
 - i) For the month, on budget at 100.6% (\$16,477 vs \$16,382).
 - ii) Year-to-date, slightly over budget at 102.2% (\$80,044 vs \$78,308).
- d. Net Operating Income (Total Income minus Expenses)
 - i) For the month, a loss of \$1,550 vs the expected loss of \$2,168.
 - ii) Year-to-date, a significant loss of \$10,484 vs the expected loss of \$5,482.
- e. Checking balance
 - i) Balance at Month-end is \$14,451.
 - ii) Previous Month-end balance was \$16,011.
- f. <u>Comments</u>
 - i) Although May member Offerings exceeded budget, For the first 5 months of the year, they have been below budget 3 of the 5 months. As a result, YTD Offerings are just 95% of what we expected. Keep in mind that for these 5 months, our budget was based on what we actually received last year.
 - ii) As a result, our year-to-date loss is nearly twice what we had projected. If this trend continues, we will significantly exceed the projected budget deficit of \$13,000.
 - iii) However, we are hoping that the positive trend shown in May (actual Offerings higher than expected and our loss for the month less than expected) will continue through the next months, so a loan from the Endowment Fund can be avoided.
 - iv) If you have overlooked sending in your offerings thus far, this would be a good time to get caught up.





Care and Maintenance of our Newly Paved Parking Lot

The paving company says that newly applied asphalt can take 6 to 12 months to fully cure and harden so there are tips and rules that should be followed.

- Probably one of the easiest and most important is to keep SPEED down. This is equally important for the safety of our guests and church members.
- Another is to NOT turn your wheels while the car is completely stopped as this can create "asphalt divots" (yes, like in golf). This usually occurs when you are pulling out of a parking spot and the asphalt is HOT. If you will get your car slightly moving before turning the wheels, it will not only save the asphalt surface, but your tires as well.
