"Shepherd me, O God, beyond my wants, beyond my fears, from death into life." (Opening words of a hymn by Marty Haugen based on Psalm 23)

Dear faithful friends and fellow children of God:

The lyrical line above from Marty Haugen's hymn invokes the emotional, faithful writings of the ancient psalmist. When hearing the hymn or reading the scripture, we can hear the writer of the 23rd Psalm expressing a cry of grief, but also of underlying faith and hope. We use this Psalm and other pieces of scripture to ground ourselves when we feel adrift, to bolster our faith when doubt and fear close in around us. It is a plea but also a statement of faith that God shepherds us through the shadow of the valley of death, whether that shadow darkens the path of ourselves, the path of known friends and family, or those known only known to us through terrible and terrifying news reports like those of the shootings over the last couple weeks.

We often feel helpless, our spirits feel raw and aching at the collective assault on our shared human connection, our bond through the Holy Spirit. We feel our frustration and that of people around us with different political leaning, trying to find different solutions to the same terrible problem, trying to prevent this from ever happening again. We ask why this could happen, again, and never really find a resolution to satisfyingly answer the question. In times like this, we call out: *"Shepherd me, O God, beyond my wants, beyond my fears, from death into life."*

When you feel lost and like there is no path forward, trust in God to be there with you, with the survivors of these terrible events, and most certainly with those who have lost their lives. If any of you wish to talk more about these events, anything else going on in your lives, or have any pastoral care needs- please reach out to me and we will sit down, talk, and pray with God.

So, until we see each other again: "May the Lord bless you and keep you; may the Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you; may the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace." (Numbers 6:24-26).

The incorrect Financial Report was in the Forecaster last month, so the reports for the periods ending March 31 and April 30 are both shown here.

FINANCIAL REPORT Ending March 31, 2022

a. Offering Envelopes

- i) For the month, just over budget at 103.6% (\$11,145 vs \$10,757).
- ii) Year-to-date, continues under budget at 93.1% (\$31,664 vs \$34,005).
- b. Total Income
 - i) For the month, over budget at 104.0% (\$16,137 vs \$15,513).
 - ii) Year-to-date, below budget at 94.0% (\$40,997 vs \$43,607).
- c. Expenses
 - i) For the month, under budget at 95.5% (\$14,631 vs \$15,316).
 - ii) Year-to-date, on budget at 100.4% (\$47,241 vs \$47,037).
- d. Net Operating Income (Total Income minus Expenses)
 - i) For the month, a surplus of \$1,506 vs the expected surplus of \$198.
 - ii) Year-to-date, a significant loss of \$6,243 vs the expected loss of \$3,429.
- e. Checking balance
 - i) Balance at Month-end is \$18,682, due to the transfer of the new loan \$100,000 to Long Term Property.
 - ii) Previous Month-end balance was \$117,191.
- f. <u>Comments</u>
 - i) Offerings for March slightly exceeded budget expectations. Given both January and February were below budget, this is encouraging.
 - ii) Now that the \$100,000 new loan proceeds have been moved from Checking to the Long Term Property account, our checking account balance back to a more normal amount. The Thrivent Mortgage was paid off in March from the Long Term Property account. Going forward, the improvements (HVAC replacement, parking lot, etc.) will be paid from this account.






