Matthew 5: 1-12

Dear faithful friends and fellow children of God: God's blessings

Over the last month, in one of my sermons, I shared the poem below. Several folks wanted to share this, so I figured, let's give it to everyone here. Blessing in the style of the Biblical Beatitudes found in the Gospel of Matthew, the poem is an homage to those 12 verses. Though it is not entitled this way, it seems to me like it should be called the Senior Beatitudes, written from the point of view of a senior who blesses those helpers around them.

blessed are they who understand my faltering step and shaking hand

blessed are they who know my ears today must strain to catch the things they say

blessed are they who seem to know that my eyes are dim and my wits are slow

blessed are they who looked away when I spilled the coffee at the table today

blessed are they with a cheery smile who take the time to check for a while

blessed are they who know the ways to bring back memories of yesterdays

blessed are they who make it known I'm loved, respected and not alone

God gives us many blessings and inspires us to be blessings for each other. The dream of having the blessing of long life is often held up as the ideal way to live, but it is optimized by having understanding, compassionate accompaniment through the years together. Whether you are young or old, God provides and is the ultimate accompaniment with us, and goes beyond that by

connecting us to others through faith who need and desire the same. That is one of the distinguishing characteristics about an organization called church; we're invested in each other's lives, loving each other for the sake of the one who loved us first, Christ Jesus. This love and a compliment steps over barriers, pierces through differences we hold up against each other, surpassing anything that would get in our way of fulfilling our call to be blessings to one another. As we look towards fall, and the seasons change God stays with us. As the seasons of our life change, Christ stays with us. As the people around us change, which happens from time to time when you live long enough, The Holy Spirit stays with us and stays with those people who we've accompanied and who accompany us. Remember the Beatitudes, let's be blessings for each other this season and all seasons, giving thanks to our Great Companion, God, who changes not, but loves us always.

So, until we see each other again: "May the Lord bless you and keep you; may the Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you; may the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace." (Numbers 6:24-26).

* Pat Myers Memorial Service is October 13th at 2:00 p.m.


* Emily Rasmussen Memorial Service is October 24th at 2:00 p.m.

FINANCIAL REPORT Ending August 31, 2022

a. Offering Envelopes

- i) For the month, just under budget at 97.6% (\$10,066 vs \$10,309).
- ii) Year-to-date, just under budget at 98.3% (\$85,339 vs \$86,607).

b. Total Income

- i) For the month, over budget at 135.1% (\$17,999 vs \$13,326).
- ii) Year-to-date, over budget at 107.0% (\$120,910 vs \$113,026).
- c. Expenses
 - i) For the month, slightly over budget at 102.8% (\$16,697 vs \$16,245).
 - ii) Year-to-date, slightly over budget at 101.4% (\$129,222 vs \$127,488).
- d. Net Operating Income (Total Income minus Expenses)
 - i) For the month, a surplus of \$1,302 vs the expected loss of \$2,919.
 - ii) Year-to-date, a loss of \$8,312 vs the expected loss of \$14,462.
- e. Checking balance
 - i) Balance at Month-end is \$16,569.
 - ii) Previous Month-end balance was \$15,325.
- f. <u>Comments</u>
 - i) For the month and YTD, Member Offerings are just below budget. While this is an improvement compared to earlier in the year, it is still concerning. This is because the budget assumed a deficit of over \$13,000 for the year. So, even if overall income and expense match our budget expectations, we would end the year with a deficit.
 - ii) The good news is that we've been blessed with a sizable memorial gift designated by the family for our general fund. This is why our Total Income exceeds budget expectations, and why our YTD deficit is just \$8,312 instead of the expected \$14,462.
 - iii) In the absence of any other such unexpected income, it is likely we will end the year with a deficit. Next year's budget will be more challenging for that reason and because we will no longer have the \$10,000 from the Campus Ministry fund to augment our income stream.

CLARIFICATION re BORROWING ENDOWMENT FUNDS


Based on comments from some members, it appears some may be unclear about the Constitutional change allowing the Church to borrow monies from Endowment. Here is the language change to Section B5.05.07 of the bylaws which was approved by the Congregation at the 2019 Annual Meeting:

Regardless of any other provision in the bylaws to the contrary, if Faith Lutheran Church is unable to financially support its ministry to the congregation, community and beyond, the Endowment Fund shall loan the amount necessary to offset budgetary deficits from available Undesignated Accounts upon the approval of twothirds written vote of those voting members present and voting at a legally called congregation meeting for said purpose. Amounts loaned shall be re-paid without interest when and if it is determined financially feasible at a subsequent legally called congregation meeting upon the approval of two-thirds written vote of those voting members present and voting. You may remember we were without a full-time Pastor for several years. Our finances had diminished as a result. The only way we could responsibly issue a Call to a new Pastor was to have a means to pay for him while our membership increased and strengthened as a result of the new Call. And, of course, the Pandemic has not helped the situation since.

As a result, when a deficit budget is presented to the Congregation, it is clearly stated that voting to approve the deficit budget "means you approve borrowing undesignated monies from the Endowment Fund as needed, as previously approved at the 2019 Annual Congregational Meeting." The intent is that the Council, not the Treasurer, would make the determination whether to borrow from the Endowment Fund. To date, we have NOT borrowed any monies from the Endowment Fund. 
