Hi! Your Pastor here!

I wanted to let you know that I am starting a new informational article from time to time. During the last month, I was in conversation with some members and they had some questions about the different things that I was wearing, since I had changed my "vestments" (distinctive clothing worn by worship leaders) and "paraments" ("hangings in the liturgical colors often used on the altar, pulpit, and lectern"*) to the blue Advent variety.

From these conversations, I figured I would share some information about what you see worship leaders, including myself, wearing during worship. I am by no means an expert, but I do like to explain why and how certain things can bring extra meaning to worshiping God and growing in faith. So, *did you know that*:

"Vestments are the distinctive dress worn by the many clergy, choir, acolyte, crucifer, verger, and others when performing the liturgical duties and participating in other ceremonies of the Church. Vestments, like many of the practices and traditions of the Church, are rooted in ancient practices-in this case the ceremonial garb of the ancient world. In the early Church, vestments were not particularly distinct from clothes worn by the general public. Eventually long tunics and mantles were discontinued in general wear, but the Christian clergy continued to use them in the church, as they had become associated with the ceremony and celebration of the liturgy. Gradually, a grand system of vestments evolved that to the modern worshiper is at once celebratory and mysterious-oddly appropriate to celebrating the sacramental mysteries!

The Reformation made its mark on vestments as well as on liturgical practice. Different churches had different policies and attitudes about vestments, but in general, the Reformers tended to simplify or in some cases eliminate vestments completely."*

As with many objects and symbols in worship, investments carried with their other meaning the addition of trying to help explain what was going on in worship and who was who. The idea was that based on the combination of vestments leaders are wearing, church goers in the pews could have context clues about various leader's roles and functions within the worship and the church. Congregations and denominations are more or less particular about who can wear vestments and what times to wear which ones. At Faith Lutheran, you'll notice that I take a practical approach during the summer and do not wear an old, but only my clerical collar and stole. But on holidays you'll see more vestments to mark the day of celebration. Pictured at the end of the article are various examples of vestments, many you will not find at our church or even our denomination, but some you'll find familiar. The following is a list of some of the most common vestments:

"alb. (Latin, alba, "white. "looks sort of like a *dress* or long tunic) An ankle-length white vestment with sleeves symbolizing purity. It is worn by all clerics at liturgical celebrations. Tied at the waist with a cincture, it may be worn with a stole and chasuble over it.

chasuble. (Latin, "little house." looks like a poncho) A vestment made of silk or other material, matching the color of the liturgy. The celebrant wears it over the alb at Holy Communion and high festivals. It is oval-shaped and sleeveless, with an opening for the head near the center. The celebrant may don this vestment immediately before beginning the Holy Communion or may wear it throughout the Mass.

cincture. (Latin, "girdle.") Symbolic of priestly purity, a cincture is a *rope* with a tassel or a four-inch-wide band of silk with a fringe, worn around the waist over the cassock or alb. With the new fitted-style albs, the cincture may be an unnecessary vestment today."*

clerical collar. The linen or plastic collar which goes around the neck or shows in the square opening at the top of the button of a usually black clerical shirt or cassock. These collars are a sign of a person's religious calling and commitment to serving God's people, and help others in the community to identify them, regardless of their faith.



"cope. (looks and sounds like *cape*) A flowing, full-length cape. It matches the color of the liturgy and is worn over an alb and stole at ceremonies other than the Mass. It is fastened over the chest by a morse, a clasp made out of precious metals and sometimes ornamented with a precious jewel.

stole. A long *scarf* of fabric matching the color of the liturgy and usually decorated with embroidered symbols. It is worn over the left shoulder and tied on the right side by deacons and over both shoulders by priests and bishops as a symbol of ordination, representing the yoke of Christ."*

So when vestments are worn, they're not just fancy clothes for show- they have meaning and purpose to elevate worship and symbolize different elements of faith. Let me know if you have

FINANCIAL REPORT Ending November 30, 2022

a. Offering Envelopes

- i) For the month, significantly under budget at 79.3% (\$9,856 vs \$12,434).
- ii) Year-to-date, on budget at 97.2% (\$105,715 vs \$108,756).

b. Total Income

- i) For the month, under budget at 97.7% (\$14,360 vs \$15,156).
- ii) Year-to-date, over budget at 106.2% (\$149,068 vs \$140,353).

c. Expenses

- i) For the month, under budget at 95.4% (\$15,953 vs \$16,727).
- ii) Year-to-date, just over budget at 101.6% (\$163,068 vs \$160,499).
- d. Net Operating Income (Total Income minus Expenses)
 - i) For the month, close to expected with a loss of \$1,593 vs the expected loss of \$1,571.
 - ii) Year-to-date, much better than expected, with a loss of \$13,999 vs the expected loss of \$20,146.

e. Checking balance

- i) Balance at Month-end is \$10,951.
- ii) Previous Month-end balance was \$12,605.

f. Comments

- i) October was a disappointing month with Member Offerings well below budget. In spite of this, our YTD loss is much lower than projected thus far, due to lower than projected expenses YTD and Memorials designated for our General Fund. If we can hit our Budget Income and Expense numbers in November and December, we may be able to end the year with a loss of \$6-7,000, instead of the projected \$13,000 loss.
- ii) Next year's budget will be more challenging because we will no longer have the \$10,000 from the Campus Ministry fund to augment our income stream.

On-Line / Electronic Giving

Faith Lutheran does not currently offer On-Line giving via our Web Site, for a variety of reasons. BUT, if you find that giving electronically (not having to write a physical check) to be your preferred method of donating to Faith Lutheran, you can always use your bank's Bill Pay service. If you already pay your bills that way, it's easy to add Faith Lutheran to your list of regular payees. Simply add a new payee/vendor (depending on what you bank calls people/companies you pay via Bill Pay) using the following address: FAITH LUTHERAN CHURCH, 28200 PORTSMOUTH DR, MENIFEE, CA 92586. Put your First and Last Name in the "Account Number" field (don't enter your envelope number as the account number, as that can change from year to year).

When you use your bank's Bill Pay service, they will print a physical check and mail it to the church. The Account Number (your First and Last Name) will be on the check, making it easy for us to credit your donations record with your gift. If your check is for something other than your regular offering, just indicate what the check is for in the Memo Line area when you use the Bill Pay service. And, if you give a specific amount each week or month, you can use your Bill Pay service to automatically send that amount to Faith Lutheran, making it even easier!
