# Refreshing Your Own Faith During the Summer

The summertime, for me, is really the most wonderful time of the year. I begin waiting for its return from the first cold morning in the autumn, and then in earnest just after the Christmas rush. Taken together, the summer months, with their long days, slower pace, smell of hamburgers on the grill, and feel of bare feet in the sand, are a taste of what heaven must be like.

It would not be terribly original for me to say, "You can take a vacation, but you can't take a vacation from your faith in God." Many of us feel like taking a break from work or school might include taking a break from the practice of our faith.

But I would suggest that this season is a huge opportunity to develop and deepen our relationship with God in Christ Jesus. One way to do that is through the "conversation with God" that we normally refer to as "prayer."

When so many voices in our social media-frenzied world are shouting at us and past us, when so many consumerist impulses are pulling and pushing us, when our careers and so many extra activities are making demands on our precious time, the "downtime" we usually get in summer is a welcomed relief. It gives us a wonderful opportunity to find the peace and quiet that is so necessary for prayer.

Prayer doesn't require us to say a word. It merely requires us to quiet our interior self, which is sometimes so noisy that it's impossible to hear what God wants to say to us.

Like the disciples who climbed Mount Tabor with Jesus, Pope Francis said, we can disengage from worldly matters "to rediscover the peaceful and regenerative silence of meditating on the Gospel,

on the reading of the Bible, which leads to a destination rich in beauty, splendor, and joy. When we meditate in this way, with the Bible in hand, in silence, we begin to feel this interior beauty, this joy that the Word of God engenders in us."

Though some vacationers will be fortunate enough to get away to actual mountains or some other place that is secluded, quiet, and full of the majesty of God's creation, we can train ourselves to mentally withdraw from the world for a while to be "alone" with God wherever we are.

Think of what Christ said about prayer. When you pray, he told his disciples, "Go to your inner room, close the door, and pray to your Father in secret" (Matthew 6:6). We can learn how to "create" a "room" for private prayer, even if we are in the midst of a crowd.

In my opinion, if there's one lesson we can take from all the craziness we see in our world today, where so many people chase after the often-empty promises of politics and the easy "answers" of drugs and violence, it's that our souls are aching for God; our hearts are simply restless without him. The summer offers us time and space to draw closer to him, not to take a vacation from his peace.

So, plan some quiet time each morning to sit in God's presence. Take a walk "with God" on a beautiful beach and know you are never abandoned. A summer with such spiritual practices will certainly spill over into the more harried months of the year.

Don't waste the opportunity that this summer offers you and your family, for it can — and will — be the most wonderful time of the year.

# FINANCIAL REPORT June 30, 2025

#### 1. Comments

- a. YTD Member giving continues to be significantly below budget and below 2024 giving.
- b. Expenses continue substantially below budget because, while we budgeted for a half-time Pastor, that position is currently vacant. Our Pastoral expenses will contain only payment for Supply Pastors during the Call processes.
- c. While our overall budget will likely run a surplus due to the low Pastoral Expenses, the Congregation should pay attention to Member Giving as a measure of our overall financial health. It is possible that we would continue to see monthly surpluses even as Member Giving runs under budget. If so, this would result in an unhealthy trend that would adversely affect our Church once we fill our vacant Pastoral position.





#### 2. Financials Review

#### a. Offering Envelopes

- i) For the month, below budget at 78% (\$10,208 vs \$13,154).
- ii) Year-to-date, significantly below budget at 79.42% (\$42,855 vs \$53,958).

## b. Total Income

- i) For the month, slightly below budget at 93.84% (\$16,119 vs \$17,176).
- ii) Year-to-date, below budget at 88.91% (\$58,852 vs \$66,189).

# c. **Expenses**

- i) For the month, significantly below budget at 81.93% (\$12,531 vs \$15,295).
- ii) Year-to-date, significantly below budget at 72% (\$46,127.37 vs \$64,061).
- d. Net Operating Income (Total Income minus Expenses)
  - i) For the month, a surplus of \$3,587 vs the expected surplus of \$1,881.
  - ii) **Year-to-date,** a surplus of \$12,725 vs the expected surplus of \$2,128.

## e. Checking balance

- i) Balance at Month-end is \$25,946.00.
- ii) Previous Month-end balance was \$22,332.93.

Sara has just landed at LAX, returning home from a conference abroad, when agents from the Risk Assessment Administration pull her aside and inform her that she will soon commit a crime. Using data from her dreams, the RAA's algorithm has determined that she is at imminent risk of harming the person she loves most: her husband. For his safety, she must be kept under observation for twenty-one days.



The agents transfer Sara to a retention center, where she is held with other dreamers, all of them women trying to prove their innocence from different crimes. With every deviation from the strict and ever-shifting rules of the facility, their stay is extended. Months pass and Sara seems no closer to release. Then one day, a new resident arrives, disrupting the order of the facility and leading Sara on a collision course with the very companies that have deprived her of her freedom.

Eerie, urgent, and ceaselessly clear-eyed, *The Dream Hotel* artfully explores the seductive nature of technology, which puts us in shackles even as it makes our lives easier. Lalami asks how much of ourselves must remain private if we are to remain free, and whether even the most invasive forms of surveillance can ever capture who we really are.



# **PARK SITE LAND SALE STATUS**

When we last updated you, there were two remaining issues to be resolved before moving into Escrow and completing the Sale.

**First Right of Refusal** – The Cell Tower agreement with Verizon gave them a First Right of Refusal. Essentially, if we want to sell any or all of our property, we first need to offer the purchase to Verizon with the same terms as the City. After notifying Verizon, they formally declined to exercise that right, clearing the way to sell the land to the City.

**Mineral Rights** - Mineral rights on and under our property are not ours to sell, going back to our original purchase of our property several decades ago. Although the City was ok not receiving those mineral rights, they needed to confirm that the State had no objection, given the State is providing a substantial grant to enable the purchase of the Park. The State had no objection, removing the final obstacle to moving into Escrow.

**Escrow** – The Purchase Agreement and CC&R's will be formally presented to the City Council for approval on August 6<sup>th</sup>. Diane will attend that City Council Meeting. Following that formal approval, Diane and I are scheduled to meet with Escrow on August 13<sup>th</sup> to sign all necessary documents for completing the sale. Escrow is estimated to run 45 days, after which the sale monies will be deposited into our account.

**Park Development** — Because this project has taken so long to get to this point, the original development cost estimate has more than doubled. So, the City is applying for a Federal grant to assist with those higher development costs. If they don't receive the grant, they will still move forward, but at a slower phased approach. At this point, the best guess is this time next year before ground will be broken, and probably a year after that before the Park is finished. Regardless, this process will have NO effect on the pending sale of the land to the City.

We're almost there!


