

# PARK SITE LAND SALE COMPLETED!

As reported at the November 16<sup>th</sup> Worship Service, Diane Swarts and I are happy to announce the Land Sale has been completed, and \$446,500 was deposited into our Provident bank account on November 13<sup>th</sup>. Council is transferring monies to other banks to keep the amounts on deposit below the maximum \$250,000 FDIC insured limit.

Linda Blanche had suggested to a City Council member that our property might be a good fit for a pocket park project for the seniors of Sun City that the City was considering. Thus began the Park Project back in November of 2021, with our first meeting with the City to discuss the possible sale of just under 2 acres of our unused property for eventual development into that Park. In December of 2021, the City proposed a project schedule which showed the sale being completed in July/August of 2022, and the Park being completed in April of 2023. They were a little optimistic.

Over the next nearly 3 years, Diane and I met numerous times with the City to negotiate a Contract with deal points to protect Faith in the coming decades. The Congregation approved those deal points in October of 2024. They are:

- 1. The City of Menifee receives a perpetual, mutual, non-exclusive Easement over our existing parking lot for Maintenance and Emergency Access.
- 2. The City of Menifee provides to Faith Lutheran the following covenants, conditions, and restrictions on the Park Site:
  - a. Wrought iron or similar fencing along the property line separating the Sites which permits clear sight lines between the Sites.
  - b. No restroom facilities, other than water stations, fountains, or similar water features.
  - c. No playgrounds, related equipment, sports fields, or similar installations.
  - d. No publicly accessible electrical outlets.
  - e. Limited hard surfaces to discourage skateboarding or similar activities.
  - f. Seating areas designed to discourage illegal activities.
  - g. City to remove existing cypress trees at southern end of the Park Site.
  - h. City to remove existing trees on the eastern end of the Church Site.
  - i. The Park Site will be maintained according to City standards.
  - j. Security for the Park Site shall be provided in a manner consistent with City standards.
  - k. The Park Site shall be deed restricted to be parkland in perpetuity unless otherwise agreed to in writing by Faith Lutheran and the California Natural Resources Agency.

Next steps for the City will be obtaining needed grant monies to help with the development and construction of the Park. Based on our experience with the sale, it will probably be 2-3 years before the Park is open.

Next steps for Faith will be the repayment of monies transferred from Endowment to the Church during 2023 and 2024. This repayment was approved by the Congregation at the Annual Congregational Meeting held February 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2025. Council will develop suggestions for how the remaining monies could be used, for approval at subsequent Special Congregational Meetings and/or at the next Annual Congregational Meeting in February.

# FINANCIAL REPORT October 31, 2025


#### 1. Comments

- a. October 2025 Member giving was significantly below budget. YTD Member giving is 18% below budget and below 2024 giving.
- b. Expenses continue substantially below budget because, while we budgeted for a half-time Pastor, that position is currently vacant. Our Pastoral expenses will contain only payment for Supply Pastors during the Call processes.
- c. While our overall budget will likely run a surplus due to the low Pastoral Expenses, the Congregation should pay attention to Member Giving as a measure of our overall financial health. It is possible that we would continue to see monthly surpluses even as Member Giving runs under budget. If so, this would result in an unhealthy trend that would adversely affect our Church once we fill our vacant Pastoral position.
- d. The Park Land Sale Escrow closed on 11/13/2025 and \$446,500 was deposited in the Provident bank account via wire transfer. \$240,000 was withdrawn from Provident via Cashier's Check and deposited in the new US Bank account. An additional \$5,000 was transferred on 11/21/2025 from Provident to US Bank. Repayment to Endowment in the amount of \$50,828.89 was issued on 11/21/2025, leaving a balance of \$395,671.11 as the remaining property sale proceeds.

- ii) **Year-to-date,** below budget at 92.31% (\$146,942 vs \$159,184).


# c. Expenses




