Jesus, thank you for reminding us of our heavenly Father's care: "Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?" (Matthew 6:26). This assurance brings us comfort and peace.

"Trust in him at all times, O people; pour out your heart before him; God is a refuge for us" (Psalm 62:8, ESV). Let us continue to seek and trust in our heavenly Father, drawing strength and comfort from His everlasting love.

PowerPoint: Operate the computer, play music, and advance the slides that are projected on the screen as we move through the service and sing the hymns.

Live Stream: Start the live broadcast of the service, choose and adjust the cameras to catch all of the action, then close down the show at the end.

Each of us also knows how to set up before the service and how to shut everything down after the service.

Interested in helping us share the joy? If you are interested in helping out, we would be delighted to teach you any one, or all of these roles. It probably *looks* more complicated than it is. Just stop by the control center after the service if you think you might like to try it out. We certainly could use a few more volunteers!



Transition Team Update

The Transition Team is nearing the home stretch in completing Faith's Ministry Site Profile (MSP). We are nearly done incorporating the congregation survey answers and the valuable input we received from the small group meetings. Once the final editing of the MSP is finished, the Transition Team will meet with the Church Council in order for the Council to approve the MSP.

We are happy to report that many people who worship with us completed the congregation surveys and participated in the small group meeting. The input from both is tremendously helpful as we complete the content of the MSP. Thank you all for the ideas and feedback.

The Church Council is in the process of appointing church members to the Call Committee, per our church Constitution and Bylaws. Soon the Council will announce the members of the Call Committee, who will then be installed during regular worship on June 22, 2025.

One of the final responsibilities of the Transition Team will be to host a meeting called the Four-Way Meeting in order to review and approve the final MSP. The attendees at this meeting will be the Church Council, the Transition Team, the Call Committee, and the Synod Bishop's Representative, Pastor Darryl Kozak. This meeting will take place on June 22 at 1:30 p.m.

On behalf of our church's Transition Team, I want to express gratitude for your incredible input and your continued prayers as we move forward with this vital work.

The Outreach Team continues to look at new ways to expand our impact of doing good in our local Menifee community. We would like to expand our work with MilVet, a local non-profit dedicated to connecting the military community to programs and resources to enrich the lives of deployed troops, veterans, and their families. Here are several ways you can get involved in supporting MilVet in their mission:

- ✓ Attend one or many of the MilVet monthly packing events. Here, care packages are assembled for deployed troops. Registration for the monthly events can be done on www.milvet.org.
- ✓ One month out of each quarter we will collect items MilVet needs to go into care packages for deployed troops. This past month, we collected 255 disposable razors and 273 single servings of instant coffee, as well as 4 \$10 Target gift cards and several toiletries. FINANCIAL REPORT for April 30, 2025

1. Comments

- a. YTD Member giving continues to be significantly below budget.
- b. Expenses continue substantially below budget because, while we budgeted for a half-time Pastor, that position is currently vacant. Our Pastoral expenses will contain only payment for Supply Pastors during the Transition and Call processes, plus the expense for our Transition Facilitator for the next several months.
- c. During the previous year, we managed to set aside monies in the New Pastor Reserve Fund which now total \$84,891.61. Current thinking is that we do not need to add to this amount, so until we call our next Pastor, we will continue to run under budget in expenses due to the open Senior Pastor position.
- d. While our overall budget will likely run a surplus due to the low Pastoral Expenses, the Congregation should pay attention to Member Giving as a measure of our overall financial health. It is possible that we would continue to see monthly surpluses even as Member Giving runs under budget. If so, this would result in an unhealthy trend that would adversely affect our Church once we fill our vacant Pastoral position.



2. Financials Review

a. Offering Envelopes

- i) For the month, below budget at 78% (\$10,208 vs \$13,154).
- ii) Year-to-date, significantly below budget at 79.42% (\$42,855 vs \$53,958).

b. Total Income

- i) For the month, slightly below budget at 93.84% (\$16,119 vs \$17,176).
- ii) Year-to-date, below budget at 88.91% (\$58,852 vs \$66,189).

c. Expenses

- i) For the month, significantly below budget at 81.93% (\$12,531 vs \$15,295).
- ii) Year-to-date, significantly below budget at 72% (\$46,127.37 vs \$64,061).
- d. **Net Operating Income** (Total Income minus Expenses)
 - i) For the month, a surplus of \$3,587 vs the expected surplus of \$1,881.
 - ii) Year-to-date, a surplus of \$12,725 vs the expected surplus of \$2,128.

e. Checking balance

- i) **Balance at Month-end** is \$25,946.00.
- ii) Previous Month-end balance was \$22,332.93.




Coffee, Conversation and You

COMING SOON From Outreach!





Newly-minted child psychologist Mina has little experience. In a field where the first people called are experts, she's been unable to get her feet wet. Instead she aimlessly spends her days stuck in the stifling heat wave sweeping across Britain, and anxiously contemplating her upcoming marriage to careful, precise researcher Oscar. The only reprieve from her small, close world is attending the local bereavement group to mourn her brother's death from years ago. That is, until she meets journalist Sam Hunter at the grief group one day. And he has a proposition for her.



Alice Webber is a thirteen year old girl who claims she's being haunted by a witch. Living with her family in their crowded home in the remote village of Banathel, Alice's symptoms are increasingly disturbing, and money is tight. Taking this job will give Mina some experience; Sam will get the scoop of a lifetime; and Alice will get better, Mina is sure of it.

But instead of improving, Alice's behavior becomes increasingly inexplicable and intense. The town of Banathel has a deep history of superstition and witchcraft. They believe there is evil in the world. They believe there are ways of...dealing with it. And they don't expect outsiders to understand.

As Mina races to uncover the truth behind Alice's condition, the dark cracks of Banathel begin to show. Mina is desperate to understand how deep their sinister traditions go—and how her own past may be the biggest threat of all.



PARK SITE LAND SALE STATUS

Things are progressing, albeit at a slow pace. We received a copy of the Preliminary Title report, which contained several items which needed to be cleared, so the Title company could issue the usual Title insurance policy benefiting the City. We provided documentation and explanation which addressed all but two items.

Mineral Rights - It turns out that in 1957, mineral rights to what would later become the Church property were given to a third party. This means that the Church owns our property, but not the mineral rights under the property. It appears that this is not uncommon for a significant portion of Sun City. So, when property is sold, it's common to simply exclude these rights from property being sold, so the original third party keeps the rights, and the new buyer (homeowners, businesses, and, yes, churches) gets title to the land but not the mineral rights. This was not discovered during an initial Title search done by the City last year, but was found this past month.

We proposed to do what others do, which is to simply exclude transferring these mineral rights to the City, since we don't own those rights to our property. However, since funding to purchase the Park Site is coming from the State, the agreements must now go back to the State for another review, and hopefully, approval to move forward by excluding these rights. This may take a few months.

First Right of Refusal - The other issue results from the Agreement the Church made with Verizon when the Cell Tower was erected. Verizon was given First Right of Refusal should we decide to sell any portion of our property, not just the portion actually being used by Verizon. Although the Park Site we are selling does NOT include the Cell Tower area, nor the easements to use our parking lot, etc., because of how the Agreement was worded, we are required to formally give notice of our intent to sell. Verizon has 30 days to meet the current offer by the City, including the price and all of the terms and conditions governing the sale. It seems unlikely that Verizon would be motivated to pay nearly half a million dollars for the Park Site, and then be required to develop the site into a Park, per our agreement with the City. Verizon will receive the formal notice before the end of May, which will start the 30-day clock.

Although it seems nothing is happening, the City continues to work on the development plans, etc. They are highly motivated to get this deal done and complete the only City park in Sun City.




Christmas in July

Our group meets once a month at Pacifica, and calls/visits and brings communion to many of our other homebound members throughout each month.




