


Faith Lutheran Church * March 2025





Lent is a deeply contemplative and solemn season in the Lutheran Church (and in many streams of Christianity). The first day of Lent is Ash Wednesday (March 5, 2025) and is a particularly solemn day when we remember that God created mankind from the dust of the earth and one day we will return as dust to the earth, unless, of course, our Lord Jesus should return first. It is good for us to remember this. We are not invincible. Death is real. We need a Savior.

The good news is that we have a Savior! His name is Jesus, the one and only Son of God, the One who lives and reigns with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. And so, in many Lutheran congregations, we begin Lent by receiving Ashes on Ash Wednesday (as a reminder, there are three reasons why Lutherans go to church to receive ashes on Ash Wednesday; the ashes remind people of their sinfulness; the ashes remind people of their mortality; third, the ashes remind people that they have been redeemed). Holy Communion is offered immediately after receiving ashes in which we remember that because Christ Jesus died and was resurrected for us, we too will be resurrected and shall inherit eternal life.

Lutherans are often asked why we participate in the season of Lent as many Christian churches do not. The primary argument against this liturgical season is that there is no biblical mandate requiring us to engage in Lenten practices. While this is true, there are many biblical examples that encourage us to participate. The best example is Christ's own 40 days in the wilderness, which prepared him for his ministry, his journey to the cross to save mankind.

Likewise, during Lent, Lutherans also take a 40-day journey (really 46 days, but the six Sundays are not counted). We also take a journey to the cross. We are not sacrificed upon the cross as Jesus was, but we follow Jesus to the foot of the cross and remain with him there like John, Mary and the others who faithfully remained with Jesus when he gave his life for ours. We, too, follow Jesus to the tomb, experiencing the darkness, the stillness, the grief of death. All these things must take place in our hearts, deep in our souls, before we can even begin to appreciate the gift that was truly given to us that first Easter morning. There is no Easter without Good Friday. There is no resurrection for us without Jesus' death on the cross. There is no cross without an intentional Spirit-filled journey.

Jesus took that journey for you and for me. During Lent, we remember that journey. We live that journey so that we may more powerfully live in the truth and joy of our salvation every single day. We embrace that journey so that we more fully embrace the reality of resurrection that awaits all who walk with Christ.

So, on Ash Wednesday, you are encouraged to come to worship at 5:00. Receive your ashes, receive the body and blood of our Lord Jesus, and begin a new journey with your brothers and sisters in Christ, a journey that is contemplative, powerful, and emotional, but will ultimately bring you to the empty tomb where we may rejoice and delight in our risen Christ and run to tell others the most wonderful words we could ever hear, "He is risen! He is risen indeed, Alleluia!"

FINANCIAL REPORT for JANUARY 31, 2025

1. Comments

- a. Member giving was significantly above budget, due to 2 large gifts representing a yearly contribution each; for the year, Member giving is above budget by 7.4%, again, due to the large year-end donations in December. These gifts caused Total Income for the month to be significantly above budget.
- b. For the year, the 2 year-end contributions boosted our Member giving to exceed budget. However, Total Income for the year was below budget because the budget included \$23,263 from the Land Sale which was not received. Overall, a good year.
- c. Monthly Expenses were substantially above budget because we chose to transfer over \$26,000 of unspent Pastoral Expense to the New Pastor Reserve Fund "savings" account on our balance sheet on December. The amount chosen for transfer resulted in ending the year overall with no loss or surplus net zero. When monies are transferred to the Balance Sheet, it results in expense on the Budget vs Actual report (also known as a Profit & Loss Statement). We now have just over \$83,000 set aside for expenses related to calling our new Pastor. I don't see a need to add anything further going forward.
- d. For the year, Expenses were under budget mostly because we didn't spend (or transfer) a little over \$17,000 of the budgeted Pastoral Expense during the year.



2. Financials Review

a. Offering Envelopes

- i) For the month, significantly above budget at 221.7% (\$31,568 vs 14,238).
- ii) Year-to-date, above budget at 107.4% (\$160,917 vs \$149,828).

b. Total Income

- i) For the month, significantly above budget at 190.9% (\$36,711 vs \$19,232).
- ii) Year-to-date, slightly below budget at 95.5% (\$213,387 vs \$223,496).

c. Expenses

- i) For the month, significantly above budget at 193.7% (\$36,711 vs \$18,952).
- ii) Year-to-date, below budget at 90.9% (\$203,243 vs \$223,496).

d. Net Operating Income (Total Income minus Expenses)

- i) For the month, a surplus of \$0 vs the expected surplus of \$280.
- ii) Year-to-date, a surplus of \$10,144 vs the expected surplus of \$0.

e. Checking balance

- i) Balance at Month-end is \$13,445.
- ii) Previous Month-end balance was \$13,526.

Transition Team Update

Hello Church Family! The Transition Team is moving along with developing our Ministry Site Profile (MSP) in preparation for our call committee who will interview potential pastors. We now have Pastor Ken Anderson who is serving as our Transition Facilitator and is working closely with the Transition Team and Council. Here is the portion of the contractual agreement that was read out loud to the congregation during the installation of our Transition Facilitator at the worship service on February 16th, 2025.

Agreement: Faith Lutheran Church agrees that Reverend Ken Anderson will serve as the "Transition Facilitator" in preparation for the call process of a rostered leader.

This contract/agreement begins February 16th, 2025 and is effective for up to six months, after which time the agreement may be extended to a month-to-month arrangement in consultation and with the approval of the Pacifica Synod Bishop.

The Transition Facilitator agrees

- to assist the Transition Team in performing the tasks needed to write the congregation's Ministry Site Profile.
- to participate with key leadership of the congregation and the appointed synodical staff person in evaluation of the transition ministry as needed and at the conclusion of their duties.
- to give special attention to the ongoing anxiety of the congregation, the lifting up and support of the lay leadership, building community and relationships.
- that they are not to be available for regular call to this congregation.
- not to be involved in the congregation's call process except when the Synod Bishop requests such participation.
- that they do not intend to become a member of this congregation after this agreement terminates, unless done so in consultation with the Bishop.

Transition Facilitator Time and Compensation

The Synod intends that the transition facilitator will be working approximately four – five hours per week in consultation with the transition team members, and church council, etc. The plan is that this will happen primarily through ZOOM meetings.

We further intend for the transition facilitator to be physically present with the congregation two or three times during the sixth month period. Also, it is suggested that the transition facilitator preach once and/or attend a Sunday Worship Service.

Compensation is \$800.00 per month

- this includes one sermon (if a called pastor is not present, then pulpit supply rates should be additional to stated compensation); \$250.00 per pulpit supply occurrence.
- longer hours for a history day or a Sunday Forum, etc. included in the weekly compensation.

Reimbursement for expenses

- automobile travel at the IRS rate
- materials pertaining to the transition (agreed upon by the transition team and congregational council/executive team in advance)

Approved and Signed

The contractual agreement was approved by our Church Council and was signed by the Church Council President, the Council Secretary, the Transition Facilitator Pastor Ken Anderson, and the Pacifica Synod Bishop David Nagler.

Survey coming soon

The transition team has been developing a brief online survey for congregation members, in order to gather some of the information that we need to fill in on the MSP. We will explain more about this online survey soon.

Small Groups

The transition team is planning to host at least 3 small group sessions in the coming weeks. These meetings will give congregation members a chance to give their input regarding their desires and thoughts for what we think is most important in a new pastor and what we should focus on as a congregation moving forward. We will announce these meetings to the congregation ahead of time, so please plan to attend one of the small group sessions once they are scheduled.

Updates to Congregation

The transition team will continue to make announcements on Sundays at least once a month with our progress and our Transition Facilitator, Pastor Anderson will provide the church council with timely progress reports.



The Cheer Committee Spreads... Cheer!






