On May 11<sup>th</sup>, we will celebrate Mother's Day, expressing gratitude for the incredible gift of mothers and their profound impact on our lives. As Christians, we understand motherhood is a sacred calling infused with love, sacrifice, and God's grace. I have often referred to spiritual moms as those who are not necessarily biological moms but serve as mother figures to others for the cause of Christ.

Proverbs 31:26-28 beautifully captures the essence of a godly mother: "She opens her mouth with wisdom, and the teaching of kindness is on her tongue. She looks well to the ways of her household and does not eat the bread of idleness. Her children rise up and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praises her." Now, it is essential to note that the picture presented here is an ideal; it is meant to offer a framework for understanding godly womanhood.

A mother's role extends beyond physical care; she plays a crucial role in spiritually, emotionally, and mentally nurturing her children. Just as God nurtures and cares for His children, mothers reflect His love and compassion in their everyday actions. Furthermore, the Bible teaches us about mothers' strength and resilience. Proverbs 31:25 states, "Strength and dignity are her clothing, and she laughs at the time to come." In times of adversity, mothers draw strength from their faith and trust in God's providence, inspiring us all with their unwavering courage. My Mom...was an example of strength and dignity, while spiritual moms exemplified faith. I am thankful for both. I am grateful my Mom became a lady of faith as well.

As we honor mothers, let's remember to express our gratitude and appreciation for their unconditional love. Ephesians 6:2-3 reminds us of the commandment with a promise: "Honor your father and mother"—which is the first commandment with a promise—"so that it may go well with you and that you may enjoy long life on the earth." Paul is teaching here that honoring our moms is a sign that we genuinely know God and results in us being blessed by the Lord.

Ultimately, Mother's Day is a time to reflect on the profound blessings of motherhood and to thank God for the precious gift of mothers, whether biological, spiritual, or both, in our lives. Let's celebrate their love, emulate their virtues, and honor them as representatives of God's grace and wisdom. How could we do any less? Soli Deo Gloria (Glory to God Alone)!



# Transition Team Update

The Transition Team is continuing to work on Faith's Ministry Site Profile (MSP). We are now focusing on gathering key information from the congregation.

We need your input. On April 21, we sent out an email with links to three online surveys for the congregation to complete. We are grateful that a number of you have already completed the online surveys. We hope that many people who worship with us will participate. We want to stress that these surveys are extremely important. Each person at Faith, should answer the survey questions themselves individually even if living in the same household as other Church members. Also, we will have paper versions of the surveys available the week of May 4, in the narthex, for those who prefer a hard copy instead of the computer. There will be a box in the narthex for the completed surveys. By gathering information from the congregation, these three surveys will help us complete Faith's MSP. The first survey seeks basic demographic information about the people in your home. The second survey asks your perspective about what gifts for ministry you believe our next pastor should have. The third survey seeks your point of view on the relative importance of the various tasks that our next pastor will need to perform.

It is extremely important that we compile completed surveys from as many folks who worship with us as possible. To help achieve this, we will have members of the Transition Team set up in the Fellowship Hall on Sunday May 4, with laptop computers in order to assist people in completing the online surveys. Please stop by after worship if you need assistance with the computer surveys.

On March 30, the Transition Team hosted the first of several small group meetings. That meeting was for current and recent Church Council members to share their input on various matters such as, the most important skills/talents of a new pastor and what activities a new pastor should focus on in the first year of his/her ministry with our congregation. That first meeting went very well.

In April we held several other small group meetings, which were open to all persons who worship with us here at Faith. We also held a small group meeting at Pacifica Assisted Living, in order to receive ideas and perspectives from some of our homebound members. During all of these sessions, we received valuable feedback. Thank you to all who participated.

On behalf of our church's Transition Team, I want to express gratitude for your helpful input and continued prayers as we move forward with this vital work.

### Land Sale Status

Diane Swarts and I met with the City on Monday April 21<sup>st</sup>. After nearly 6 months of waiting, the State finally blessed the applicable documents we negotiated on your behalf and which you approved at the Special Congregational Meeting last October.


Now, everything is in the hands of the City of Menifee, so hopefully things will move with less delay. There will be a formal approval of the documents by the City Council at their May 21<sup>st</sup> meeting. We anticipate going into Escrow by the end of June, with a closing hopefully by the end of August. The City anticipates 8-10 months after that to complete the development of the Park.

#### **FINANCIAL REPORT for MARCH 31, 2025**

#### 1. Comments

- a. Member giving continues to be significantly below budget.
- b. As said last month Expenses continue substantially below budget because, while we budgeted for a half-time Pastor, that position is currently vacant. Our Pastoral expenses will contain only payment for Supply Pastors during the Transition and Call processes, plus the expense for our Transition Facilitator for the next several months.
- c. During the previous year, we managed to set aside monies in the New Pastor Reserve Fund which now total over \$83,000. Current thinking is that we do not need to add to this amount, so until we call our next Pastor, we will continue to run under budget in expenses due to the open Senior Pastor position.
- d. While our overall budget will likely run a surplus due to the low Pastoral Expenses, the Congregation should pay attention to Member Giving as a measure of our overall financial health. It is possible that we would continue to see monthly surpluses even as Member Giving runs under budget. If so, this would result in an unhealthy trend that would adversely affect our Church once we fill our vacant Pastoral position.



#### 2. Financials Review

#### a. Offering Envelopes

- i) For the month (5 Sundays), below budget at 90.56% (\$13,127 vs \$14,496).
- ii) Year-to-date, significantly below budget at 80.01% (\$32,647 vs \$40,804).

#### b. Total Income

- i) For the month, slightly below budget at 96.05% (\$17,350 vs \$18,063).
- ii) Year-to-date, below budget at 87.19% (\$42,734 vs \$49,014).

#### c. Expenses

- i) For the month, significantly below budget at 70.63% (\$10,941 vs \$15,491).
- ii) Year-to-date, significantly below budget at 68.89% (\$33,596 vs \$48,767).
- d. Net Operating Income (Total Income minus Expenses)
  - i) For the month, a surplus of \$6,408 vs the expected surplus of \$2,572.
  - ii) Year-to-date, a surplus of \$9,138 vs the expected surplus of \$247.

#### e. **Checking balance**

- i) Balance at Month-end is \$22,332.93.
- ii) Previous Month-end balance was \$16,298.20.

Continuous learning guides us as we walk in faith with Christ daily. Join us to grow your faith in 2025!




### CALLING ALL PET LOVERS AND OWNERS!
