Dear faithful friends and fellow children of God:

I started my Forecaster message back in July talking about the receding of the pandemic and its restrictions. At the time it seemed like we were finally seeing the end of this terrible period in our lives, that we would continue in the trajectory of lifting restrictions and getting on with our lives, regaining some sense of normalcy. The feelings we all had, the desire for and sample of lifted stresses and restrictions seem bizarre now that things have taken steps back into more restrictions. On top of that, there have been plenty of other events featured in the news and looming in the back of our minds; things like natural disasters and troubling ends to global conflicts. It seems like we have received some sort of social and emotional whiplash, moving in a good direction only to be snapped back the way we had just come from. This kind of whiplash is painful, confusing, and discouraging. And yet...

And yet, the Lord tells us: "Be strong, do not fear! Here is your God!" Not in some heaven light-years away; our God is right here, amidst the whiplash, among our beloved community of Faith Lutheran Church, and every other community around the globe which might have reason to have fearful hearts. God knows our hearts, God knows our frustrations and even grief around being pulled back into mask mandates and postponements and precautions. God dwells with us in all of the swirling emotions dealing with the world today, acute crises which spike our anxiety, as well as the long-term effects of a pandemic that has spanned over 17 months.

God equips us to cope with all of this, giving us tools and even turning the tables on bad situations to provide us with valuable lessons learned for the future. For example: We have developed and adapted new patterns and routines and strategies of living over the last year and a half especially, not to speak of all of our experience developed over our lifetime. It will all serve us well to remember the training we have garnered from the ordeals of life.

Faith and our faith community. When the world seems to feel distant, know that God draws closer to you. So, too, you should draw closer to God and your fellow children of God. Even as we maintain social distancing, don't drift away from your faith or community of faith. Lean in.

Hope springs eternal in God. The author and bringer of hope, God gives hope when we feel our most angry, worn out, and shaken. When there's nothing left in our tanks, God ALWAYS provides us with hope. God interweaves and splices hope into the reality we find ourselves in and into the real expectations of precautions and actions for safety. We have and are going through traumatic times in our individual and collective lives; that's real. And so is the hope God gives us, hope and eagerness for the normalcy we got a taste of back in July, hope for when that is no longer

a short reprieve but rather the new reality we inhabit. If God can open the eyes of the blind, make the deaf to hear, and the lame to leap, then God can get us through any crisis we encounter. God will lead the way, will take each of us by the hand, pulling us out from anxiousness and replacing fearful hearts with ones that shout for joy. That day will come, this is most certainly true.

*So, until we see each other again: "May the Lord bless you and keep you; may the Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you; may the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace." (Numbers 6:24-26).*

## FINANCIAL REPORT Ending July 31, 2021

a. **Offering Envelopes**

- i) **For the month**, we are significantly above budget at 127.2% (\$10,333 vs \$8,124).
- ii) **Year-to-date**, we are just over budget at 101.8% (\$76,291 vs \$74,919).

b. **Total Income**

- i) **For the month**, significantly above budget at 131.7% (\$13,151 vs \$10,283).
- ii) **Year-to-date**, well above budget at 117.2% (\$111,722 vs \$95,366).

c. **Expenses**

- i) **For the month**, under budget at 95.7% (\$14,515 vs \$15,168).
- ii) **Year-to-date**, under budget at 95.5% (\$102,960 vs \$107,826).

d. **Net Operating Income** (Total Income minus Expenses)

- i) **For the month**, we had a small loss of \$974 vs. the expected loss of \$4,886.
- ii) **Year-to-date**, much better than expected with a profit of \$8,763, vs. the expected loss of \$12,460.

e. **Checking balance**

- i) **Balance at Month-end** is \$24,768.
- ii) **Previous Month-end balance** was \$25,729.

f. **Comments**

- i) July Member giving was above budget for the second month in a row. As a result, our YTD member giving is now slightly over budget at 101.8%. In-person Worship services seems to be helping our finances.
- ii) YTD Total Income and Net Operating Income are way above budget due to \$15,000 in Special Offerings from deceased members earlier this year.

Dear Spirit-filled Women of Faith,

September, the beginning of fall, with all its beautiful colors and bountiful harvest is here!

Our fall Bible studies include three sessions on the gift of the Spirit. Celtic Christians likened the Holy Spirit not to a dove, but to a goose. In these three sessions of the **fall Gather Bible study**, the Rev. Sara Olson-Smith, associate pastor at St. Paul Lutheran Church, Davenport, Iowa, will lead us on our own divine Wild Goose chase. We'll track the Holy Spirit's actions throughout the Bible and throughout our lives. We'll explore how the Spirit moves God's people into adventures and lives we would never dare risk on our own.

The Holy Spirit might be the most misunderstood or mysterious member of the Trinity, but the Spirit of scripture is not shy. In **September's Session 1, "Spirit of God: Revealer and Resource"**, we'll uncover the bold, truth-telling Spirit active in our lives. After a quick review of the mystery of the Trinity, we'll read parts of Jesus' farewell discourse, and hear how the Spirit continues to reveal the truth of Jesus to us and to the world. We'll discuss how the gift of the Holy Spirit is a resource for God's people, giving us power we need to do God's work. **Select the time that's best for you, and join in the conversation!** Circle Bible studies meet the second Tuesday and Wednesday of each month. **See the calendar below and come – you are ALWAYS welcome!!**

We began with a quick review of Session 1: "Just Wisdom", which would guide us into all truth, Session 2: "Just Truth", even when challenging, and Session 3: "Just Hope" – now is the perfect time for hope! Christ is our hope and bigger than our human situation.
