Dear faithful friends and fellow children of God: Faith and focus, patience and perseverance.

God's presence continues to remain true and needed in our lives this year as the pandemic has progressed. Fortified by God's promises of accompaniment and hope, our congregation has adapted, innovated, and stubbornly marched on in faith this last year. We give thanks for God's continued presence and we persevere on, continuing to do God's work with our hands. Some highlights of what our congregation has done this year are:

- Registered our youth and began planning for the National Youth Gathering in Minneapolis, MN July 2022.
- ❖ We adapted our worship style to continue worshiping, transitioning from worshiping inperson in our parking lot to returning joyfully and safely inside to our sanctuary. We had our Reopening Indoor Worship on May 9.
- We resumed many ministries face to face and drew closer together as we reacquainted ourselves with our fellow faith members as well as new friends including two new member classes.
- Several members and I participated in a multi-church education program called "Dialogues on Race," where we engaged faith with fellow Lutherans in facing the problem of racism. One of the immediate results has been the reinvigoration of Outreach and how we can be more welcoming to more people.
- ❖ We had two baptisms, the first ones I have presided over. I had the joy and honor of baptizing baby Linus Butler on Palm Sunday and Andrew Quinn on Easter Sunday. I also officiated my first wedding in Arizona in November.
- On Reformation Sunday, we welcomed new members and we heard Martin Luther (who looked very similar to David Moe) read his speech from the Diet of Worms.
- And we have begun two large, exciting possible ministry opportunities. The first is refinancing our mortgage to make large repairs and improvements to our church property and building. The second is working with our city to explore selling the dirt lot behind the church. The lot would become a park and the proceeds of the sale would allow us to dream and expand current and new ministries.

All of these events, actions, and ministries have proved our perseverance and persistence in faith in the face of the ongoing pandemic. We have proved that the pandemic cannot keep us from praising God or living in ministry. We have chosen to adapt, to change, even to postpone some of our "normal" activities in the cause of loving our neighbors and promoting proper safety. However, even those paused activities are what we are hoping to resume this year, as long as we can do them safely. We hope to take further steps towards normalcy in fellowship, music leadership, and other

ministries which have seen less activity in the pandemic. Faith and focus, patience and perseverance. This is our way, this is what God has taught us and our ancestors in faith. Ancestors like the new testament prophet Anna.

The story of Anna is seemingly small, only a couple of verses long and nestled into many other, seemingly bigger stories. However, there is much we can learn from those 3 verses. Namely, after so much happening in her long life, she still praises God and finds her vocation in helping and leading at her house of worship. She does not let widowhood, the loss of her partner, distract her. Instead, through faith and focus, she dedicates her life to helping others in faith and, in doing so, she finds her Savior. We cannot all be prophets like Anna, we cannot all live exactly as she did, in fact, we are not meant to live "exactly" as anyone else. But Anna gives us a vision, a prophecy if you will, for the future - our future. Her vision and lessons for you and me today are ones of perseverance, hope, and not letting societal expectations around experience or age or gender or relationship or anything else hold you back from leading and contributing in faith. Anna did not let anyone tell her: "Oh, you're just an old widow who doesn't know anyone or go anywhere, you can't do this job at the temple." No, Anna broke through those barriers, she met new people every day, she learned new ways to help every day, even into her advanced years. And she kept doing it and giving thanks to God and eventually became one of the first proclaimers of the Gospel message that Jesus, the Redeemer of Jerusalem and the world, had arrived on Earth to save us all.

Anna's faith and focus, patience and perseverance pay off and God rewards her faithfulness with more faithfulness. Anna sees the advent of God's ever-presence, Jesus' arrival, the beginning of his time to change and save us all. And so God and Anna are speaking to you right now, offering you the same advice of faith and focus, patience and perseverance as well as the same opportunity which Anna had, to serve in faith and help those around you in new and old ways, in new and old people. This is our vision for the coming year in ministry. Anna proves that at any time in life, you can defy expectations, you can overcome loss and grief, loneliness, and advanced age - to do all of this and do God's extraordinary work with your own actions. As another pastor wrote in response to Anna's story: "God is always faithful. God might call us to a new vocation at any age. God will use the whole path of our lives to help bring in God's kingdom." In this theological mindset, I offer this prayer: O God, give us grace to set a good example to all among whom we live, to be just and true in all our dealings, to be strict and conscientious in the discharge of every duty; pure and temperate in all enjoyment, gracious and generous and courteous toward all; so that the mind of Jesus Christ may be formed in us and all may know that we are his disciples; in whose name we pray. Amen.

God gives us the gifts of faith and focus, patience and perseverance. I believe through these gifts, we can fill this next year with joy, we can satisfy more of our desire to return to normalcy, and we can forge more what faith looks like in our new day in age. In all of this, we ask God to help and guide us.

I continue to give thanks for all of you, for your continued faithfulness, and for the great honor of serving as your pastor. So, until we see each other again: "May the Lord bless you and keep you; may the Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you; may the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace." (Numbers 6:24-26).

I see the world with the realization that we love big. Therefore, I write my own headlines. "Husband loves wife today". "Family drops everything to come to Grandma's bedside". He patted my hand "Old man, makes new friend". His words collide with my worries, freeing them from the tether I had been holding tight. They float away. I am left with renewed spirit. My headline now reads "woman overwhelmed by the spirit of kindness and the reminder that our capacity to love is never ending."

FINANCIAL REPORT Ending December 31, 2021

a. Offering Envelopes

- i) For the month, over budget at 110.2% (\$16,339 vs \$14,831).
- ii) Year-to-date, slightly above budget at 104.2% (\$138,432 vs \$132,858).

b. Total Income

- i) For the month, slightly below budget at 98.3% (\$20,906 vs \$21,261).
- ii) Year-to-date, above budget at 112.8% (\$191,358 vs \$169,532).

c. Expenses

- i) For the month, over budget at 111.0% (\$17,111 vs \$15,414).
- ii) **Year-to-date,** under budget at 98.3% (\$182,422 vs \$185,571).
- d. Net Operating Income (Total Income minus Expenses)
 - i) For the month, below expected at \$3,795 vs. the expected surplus of \$5,847.
 - ii) **Year-to-date,** significantly better than expected with a surplus of \$8,936, vs. the budgeted loss of \$16,039.

e. **Checking balance**

- i) Balance at Month-end is \$24,934.
- ii) Previous Month-end balance was \$21,127.

f. **Comments**

i) Thanks to our faithful members, we finished the year in great shape! Instead of a significant deficit, we finished with a sizable surplus with which to start the new year. What a blessing!


