Introduction to the day

As we are invited today to consider what it means to be managers (rather than owners) of all that we have, it is crucial to recognize that we are bought with a price. "Christ Jesus, himself human, . . . gave himself a ransom for all." Apart from the generosity of God we have nothing—we are nothing. By God's gracious favor we have everything we need.

GOSPEL MESSAGE: True Riches

Being stuck in unjust systems is exhausting. Perhaps they are designed to frustrate and impede any efforts to undo their power. The manager in Jesus' parable does what he can to make the most of his precarious position, but his resolution still leaves a lot to be desired. Does the rich man remain in his wealthy and powerful position? What about all the others who still owe the estate? Why does the manager, and not the rich landowner who holds all the cards, become the object lesson?

It seems Jesus is getting serious here about our relationships with money, riches, and power: "You cannot serve God and wealth" (Luke 16:13). That much is clear. But perhaps Jesus is drawing our attention to the larger implications of God's economy and what it means to lean on one another for the sake of justice in our world. Luke's gospel began with Mary's song, after all, extolling the ways the poor will be lifted up in the kin-dom Jesus brings. In this new reign, all resources are brought into the service of those who need them most. Faithful living here and now might look different from what we're accustomed to when we consider what God has in mind, especially when we are used to unhelpful contemporary mantras like "Might makes right" and "Winner takes all."

True to Mary's song, Jesus indeed turns our world upside down, which distresses those of us who appreciate good order. But in the end, this turning does what is needed to make the world right. In our world today, we may struggle with the forgiveness of debts and the redistribution of wealth, but Jesus doesn't. God brings the true riches of justice and love for all and will not fail to do what is needed to make sure every last beloved person on earth has what they need to truly live.

CHILDREN'S CHAT

God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song.

FIRST LESSON INTRODUCTION

Of all the OT prophets, none is more passionate about social justice than Amos. This outburst of prophetic wrath promised nothing but destruction for Israel caused by the grave injustices of the times. It would appear that normal business operations were postponed during the festival celebrating the beginning of a new month ("the new moon" in vs. 5) and also for the weekly sabbaths. That prevented the merchants from making as much profit as they would have liked. The return for scarce produce of the poor was being manipulated by false balances, inaccurate measures and low prices (vss. 5b-6). Amos promised that God will not

forget any of these misdeeds. Is that not often the attitude of many in every generation who achieved made great wealth through less than just means?

LECTOR: FIRST READING: Amos 8:4-7

⁴ Hear this, you who trample on the needy, and bring to ruin the poor of the land, ⁵ saying, "When will the new moon be over so that we may sell grain, and the Sabbath, so that we may offer wheat for sale? We will make the ephah smaller and the shekel heavier and practice deceit with false balances, ⁶ buying the poor for silver and the needy for a pair of sandals and selling the sweepings of the wheat." ⁷ The LORD has sworn by the pride of Jacob: Surely I will never forget any of their deeds.

PSALM INTRODUCTION

This psalm of praise also conveys a message of social justice in God's concern for the poor and the homeless woman seeking shelter for her children. It also conveys some of the fundamental theological concepts of the Old Testament. These unusual words contain a vignette of the way many poor people the world over still eke out a meagre existence by rooting in the garbage discarded by the more affluent. For the psalmist, this social upheaval based on economic realities is a token of Yahweh's absolute sovereignty over human affairs.

LECTOR: PSALMODY: Psalm 113

- ¹ Hallelujah! Give praise, you servants of the LORD; praise the name of the LORD.
- ² Let the name of the LORD be blessed, from this time forth forevermore.
- ³ From the rising of the sun to its going down let the name of the LORD be praised.
- ⁴ The LORD is high above all nations; God's glory above the heavens.
- ⁵ Who is like the LORD our God, who sits enthroned on high,
- ⁶ but stoops to behold the heavens and the earth?
- ⁷ The LORD takes up the weak out of the dust and lifts up the poor from the ashes,
- ⁸ enthroning them with the rulers, with the rulers of the people.
- ⁹ The LORD makes the woman of a childless house to be a joyful mother of children. Hallelujah!

SECOND LESSON INTRODUCTION

Paul's letters to Timothy and Titus are what's known as the Pastoral Epistles. They specify some of the intentions that believers today should keep in mind regarding the community's prayer. The prayer is for everyone, expressing the Pastoral Epistles' concern for universal salvation. The diverse country in which we live mirrors that of the first-century Roman Empire of the Pastoral Epistles. They were diverse in terms of class in that household owners mixed with their day laborers and slaves in the community. Christians were aware of how religious views exposed them both to ridicule and even persecution.

LECTOR: SECOND READING: 1 Timothy 2:1-7

¹ First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for everyone, ² for kings and all who are in high positions, so that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and dignity. ³ This is right and acceptable before God our Savior, ⁴ who desires everyone to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. ⁵ For there is one God; there is also one mediator between God and humankind, Christ Jesus, himself human, ⁶ who gave himself a ransom for all—this was attested at the right time. ⁷ For this I was appointed a herald and an apostle (I am telling the truth; I am not lying), a teacher of the gentiles in faith and truth.

GOSPEL INTRODUCTION

In the parable, the rich master who owns enslaved peoples and commends dishonesty for the sake of profits is not condemned. Jesus creates a dichotomy between slaving (douleuo) for God and for wealth, given that wealth is generally built upon the backs of the enslaved, women, the poor, and the oppressed; that wealth for one usually presumes poverty for many. The larger the wealth gap in favor of a few, the more people are impoverished. We should choose to be more conscious and strategic in our daily transactions and speech so that we contribute

less to the pursuit of wealth for ourselves and others, particularly in the service of greed and creation of poverty, and at the expense of equality and the justice and love of God.

P: GOSPEL: Luke 16:1-13

The holy gospel according to Luke.

Glory to you, O Lord.

¹ Then Jesus said to the disciples, "There was a rich man who had a manager, and charges were brought to him that this man was squandering his property. ² So he summoned him and said to him, 'What is this that I hear about you? Give me an accounting of your management because you cannot be my manager any longer.' ³ Then the manager said to himself, 'What will I do, now that my master is taking the position away from me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg. ⁴ I have decided what to do so that, when I am dismissed as manager, people may welcome me into their homes.' 5 So, summoning his master's debtors one by one, he asked the first, 'How much do you owe my master?' ⁶ He answered, 'A hundred jugs of olive oil.' He said to him, 'Take your bill, sit down quickly, and make it fifty.' 7 Then he asked another, 'And how much do you owe?' He replied, 'A hundred containers of wheat.' He said to him, 'Take your bill and make it eighty.' 8 And his master commended the dishonest manager because he had acted shrewdly, for the children of this age are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. ⁹ And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of dishonest wealth so that when it is gone they may welcome you into the eternal homes. 10 "Whoever is faithful in a very little is faithful also in much, and whoever is dishonest in a very little is dishonest also in much. ¹¹ If, then, you have not been faithful with the dishonest wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? 12 And if you have not been faithful with what belongs to another, who will give you what is your own? 13 No slave can serve two masters, for a slave will either hate the one and love the other or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth."
