August 13, 2022

Call to Order by President Gravens at 10:34 a.m.

Those Present: Vicki Gravens, Beth Nagel, Marilyn Corey, Phyllis Times, Jim Tomes, Garland Vanzant

July Minutes were approved on motion by Phyllis and second by Marilyn with one correction. Deadline for submission of the free full page program ad to Phyllis Tomes is August 20th not September 1st.

Marilyn gave the Treasurers report. There are 70 people pre-registered for Convention. \$149.32 has been spent on the courtesy bags for callers. Motion to approve by Garland, second by Beth. Motion carried.

Travis has submitted the caller list for the convention, but Phyllis still needs complete info on some callers for the program book.

Vicki reported that the Center for Rural Development has informed her that they will not be opening the concession stand this year so there will be no concession stand at the convention this year. They also informed her that the Green Room will not be available for use by the callers but they can use a portion of the utility room as long as they do not interfere with center workers.

It was decided to keep same program printer as last year as they are the least expensive.

Jill and Lake Cumberland have agreed to do 2023 decorations as well as 2022. They are much appreciated.

Renee Head has agreed to do the used clothing sale and bring some helpers. Thanks to Renee. Clothing sale will be open Thursday 7-9 and Saturday 12-4.

Phyllis and Jim will again take care of flags and schedule poster.

Discussion of needs for registration table. Marilyn has raffle tickets and all else set.

Travis wants the main hall open at 1:00 p.m. on Saturday. It was agreed to make that change even though it shortens the lunch break. Travis will hold the caller meeting from 12:00 to 1:00 on Saturday. It was agreed to get sandwiches again from Subway for caller meeting and VanZant will pick them up.

It was noted that Do-Si-Does are donating \$200 to help cover convention expense. It was agreed to give them a special recognition in the program booklet to show appreciation.

A discussion was held on whether or not we should advertise the convention in the Somerset newspaper, the Commonwealth Journal. It was decided not to do so due to the expense and that all the dancers in the area already know about the convention.

2023 flyer and ribbon approved for the theme as approved in July. 300 ribbons to be ordered.

The Marriott Courtyard are increasing room rates for 2023 to \$119 plus taxes. Other hotels prices not

yet known but almost certainly will be higher.

The Center for Rural Development is also raising prices for 2023 as current contract has expired. It is not yet known what the price increase will be. The increase will be evaluated and, since the current contract is up, other locations may be considered as necessary for budgetary purposes.

Early Bird Special for 2023 ribbons will be \$20 if bought Friday or Saturday of the 2022 convention.
