The "Gift of Safety"



Working with partnered referral agencies, Safe Community's Car Seat Technicians (CPST's) support families in need, providing a new car seat that is a proper fit for the child and vehicle. Recipients leave with the confidence to install and use their new seat correctly. We share best practice recommendations while recognizing real world situations.

→ Recipients

Recipients are approved based on an application process. The program is considered a one-time-use program and seats are chosen based on the longevity of use for that child and family situation. Recipients are required to meet with one of our CPSTs to learn how to properly use and install the seat.

→ Costs

Increasing costs of car seats and access in our area has led to a strain on the program. The need for seats is increasing. The average car seat purchased for the program costs \$250.

Safe Riders Helmet Exchange & Bike Events


→ Helmet Exchange

Safe Community hosted several helmet exchange events in 2024. The popular Family Safety Day saw a reduced number of participants due to weather. Community members were invited in to our office, bike safety events, and the Summer Safety Splash to exchange their broken or expired helmet for a new, properly fitted helmet for youth. Thank you to our helmet sponsor this year, Canadian Natural.


With Canadian Natural's help we were able to provide safe, properly fitted helmets to over 150 children and youth.

→ Safety Events

Bike safety events and presentations focus on safe riding skills, pedestrian safety, and properly fitting helmets on children. Working with local school districts, RCMP, Bylaw, and rural communities, Safe Community hosts bike/scooter/roller blade safety presentations and obstacle courses where children can put their newly learned skills to the test by practicing hand signals, safe braking and vehicle interactions. Children learn about road signs and walking bikes across the road. Safe Community encourages everyone to wear a proper helmet whenever they have wheels under their feet.









→ WHAT IS IT?

A hands-on, interactive course for anyone 13+ studying for or struggling to pass the Class 7 Learner's License written test.

L2D Program

→ WHAT DO PARTICIPANTS LEARN?

L2D follows the Alberta Drivers Guide for Light Vehicles. With a focus on safety, we cover laws, signage, common test questions and tips. The course is constantly evolving to follow the newest Alberta Traffic Safety laws, in some instances adding content to the course based on participant feedback of test questions they found challenging.

→ HOW DO THEY LEARN?

In a small group setting, L2D utilizes practice tests, flashcards, videos, and intersection tiles to practice real life situations.

→ DO THEY PASS?

Smart Choices, Safe Streets

850 BAGS COLORED Safe Community Wood Buffalo is a proud partner of SADD Alberta, distributing bag packages to classes and working to remove barriers to participation. With the help of elementary, junior and senior high students, 850 bags were colored and distributed to five different liquor stores. The messages remind drivers to drive safe and drive sober.

10 CLASSES COLORING WITH RCMP Thank you to the RCMP Community Policing Unit for their support of the program.

Ten elementary classes colored with SCWB and RCMP. They were able to ask questions about policing and share ideas for bags. Classes learn at a grade appropriate level what safe driving is and how they can encourage drivers to be safe on the streets they use.









Supporting Community

→ Seniors and Elders

Thank you to our community partners for inviting us to provide cyber safety awareness workshops including commons scams and how to spot them, and online dating safety.

We facilitate falls prevention workshops which include a fall prevention bingo game.

→ Newcomers

Safe Community Wood Buffalo was able to offer Winter Preparedness for Newcomers workshops to Keyano students, YMCA and Multicultural Society Clients, and The WBRL Language Learners group. Newcomers were also offered workshops on scams targeting new Canadians, L2D courses, and car seat education.

→ ATC Transport

Safe Community coordinated volunteers and delivered the Elders Transportation for ATC Cultural Festival. Providing a safe ride for Elders to and from the Cultural Grounds, we enjoyed learning and engaging with Elders from all over Wood Buffalo and beyond. Estimated 800 rides were given.

- → Halloween safety information was given to over 1000 students through virtual and in person presentations. Safe Community supported The Hub Family Resource Center's Halloween event.
- Safe Community supports other local agencies through volunteering. Whether taking a casino shift or participating in an event, Safe Community values our partnerships.
- Safe Community prioritizes providing equitable services to all in our region. We have taken trainings in Cultural Awareness, Indigenous Awareness, Neurodiversity, Age Sensitivity, and Pride YMM training.
