- Supervises and directs assignments to field operators
- Develops infrastructure management plan for operations and maintenance
- Works with the Operations Manager in developing department plans, schedules and day to day tasks
- Works with the Operations Manager in preparation of annual budgets and strategic planning
- Monitors monthly and quarterly budget activity
- Works to maintain compliance of water and wastewater systems, such EPA and local government regulations
- Maintains operator certifications for water and wastewater systems
- Manages and oversees I.H.S Sanitation and Construction Projects
- Develops and presents reports when required by management and Board
- Maintains an effective estimation data base for construction and service projects
