
2024-2025 School Year



Priority 1: All Students Read Well

By June 2025, the Acadience Reading Composite Score for all students in Grades K-2 will improve overall by 9%, from 46% to 55% of students scoring on or above grade level benchmark.

Priority 1: All Students Read Well

By June 2025, all students in grades 3–5 scoring on or above benchmark (Tier 1) will improve by 8.6%, from 41.3% to 50%, as measured by the i–Ready informational text domain.

Priority 1: All Students Read Well

By June 2025, the average performance of English Language Learners (ELL) and Students with disabilities (SWD) in grades 3–5 scoring in Tier 1 on the ELA i-Ready diagnostic will improve by 15 percentage points, from 20% to 35%

Priority 2: All students are physically and emotionally safe

By June 2025, teachers will empower students to utilize communication, empathy and problem solving skills as measured by a 9% increase, from 89% to 98%, of favorable responses to the school survey question "At this school students harass, bully, or intimidate other students".

Priority 3: All students have a high-quality academic experience

By June 2025, the percentage of all tested students in grades K-5 scoring at Tier 1 will increase by 13% from 39% to 52% as measured by the overall placement on the i-Ready Math Diagnostic.

Priority 3: All students have a high-quality academic experience

By June 2025, the percentage of students with disabilities in grades K-5 scoring at Tier 1 will increase by 13%, from 15% to 28%, as measured by the overall placement on the i-Ready Math Diagnostic.

Priority 3: All students have a high-quality academic experience

By June 2025, the percentage of ELL/MLL students in grades K-5 scoring at Tier 1 will increase by 14%, from 26% to 40%, as measured by the overall placement on the i-Ready Math Diagnostic.

Priority 4: All students graduate college and career ready

By June 2025, the percentage of current second grade students with active NYC Kids Rise college savings accounts and who completed building block 1 will increase by 10 percentage points, from 48% to 58%, as measured by NYC Kids Save for College Program Report.

Priority 5: All districts and schools are more inclusive and responsive for parents and families

By June 2025, the number of parents attending workshops about math instruction and math curricula will increase by 5 parents, from 14 to 19, as measured by zoom attendance reports and Parent Coordinator sign in sheets for in person meetings.

Section 5: Chronic Absenteeism

By June 2025, the percentage of students who are chronically absent will decrease by 3%, from 41% to 38%, as measured by the New Visions Chronic Absenteeism Reports.
