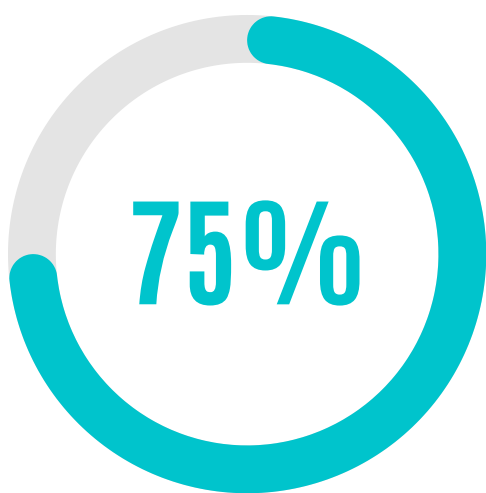


# "Homeless Recidivism" Mid-Project Data Highlights

20 Participants - Currently Experiencing Homelessness

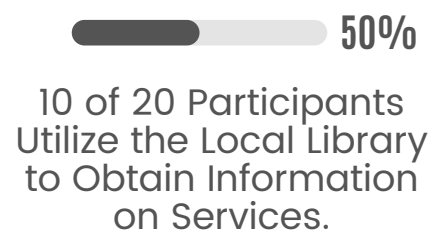
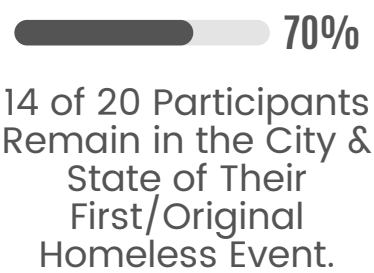
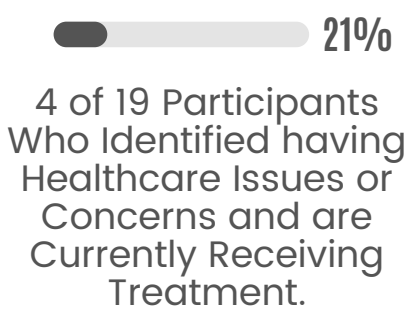


19 of 20 Participants Identified Some Form of Healthcare Issue/Concern (Physical, Behavioral, or Addiction). This Equates to 95% of Participants.



15 of 20 Participants Identified at Least One Physical Healthcare Concern. This Equates to 75% of Participants.

Substance Abuse and Mental Health Combined Attributed to 13 of 20 of Original Homeless Events.



"Services now are so scattered, which causes confusion and hardship. We need a Consolidated Triage Care Center that brings programs and services under one roof." Project Participant



239 - Average Number of Shelter Stays/Nights per Participant (18 of 20) (2 Participants Identified as Never Staying in a Shelter)



\$6,931.00 - per Participant Cost of Shelter Stays/Nights (239). (Estimate - \$29 Nightly Shelter Cost - per Person)

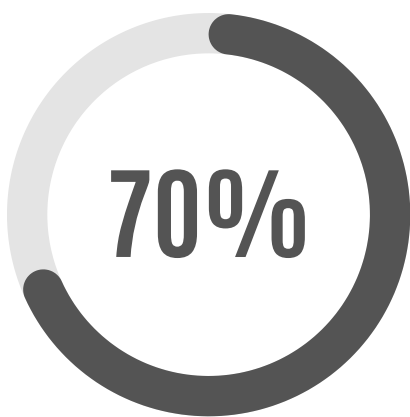

17 of 18 (94%) Participants Who Previously Stayed in a Shelter had Unsuccessful Shelter Outcomes/Returned to Homelessness.



14 of 18 Participants (78%) Who Previously Stayed in a Shelter Did Not Make Progress Towards Goals While in the Shelter.

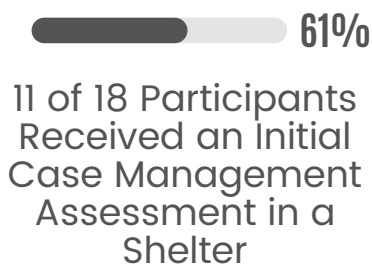


14 of 20 Participants (70%) Have Never Been Housed Through a Housing Assistance Program.

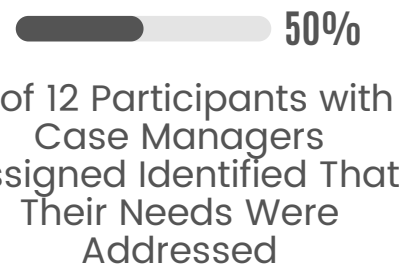
100% of Participants (6) Who Were Previously Housed Through a Housing Assistance Program Recidivated Back into Homelessness



100% of Participants (6) Identified the Root Cause of First Homeless Event Led to Recidivism (Re-entering Homelessness from Housing Program).

## Mid-Project Data Analysis

- Lack of Effective Initial Intake Assessments/Evaluation of Needs in Shelter Significantly Reduced Case Management Effectiveness.
- Homeless Recidivism was Directly Connected to Original Needs and Barriers Not Being Effectively Identified and Addressed.
- Health/Wellness Concerns Correlated with and Contributed to Homeless Recidivism.
- Participant Safety Concerns were a Significant Factor in Unsuccessful Shelter Exits & Outcomes.
- A Consolidated Care Center Utilizing a Triage Model of Care Would Enhance Overall Accessibility and Services to Unsheltered Individuals.
