Biopsychosocial (BPS) in Homelessness Research Project

Biopsychosocial (BPS) in Homelessness (South Carolina) includes case studies of chronic and acute homeless individuals utilizing a Biopsychosocial (BPS) Model. The BPS model is an interdisciplinary model that analyzes the interconnection between biology, psychology, and socio-environmental factors. The research specifically examines how these aspects play a role within homelessness. The study highlights a group and/or specific factors/causes which correlate BPS practices/processes with homelessness.

4 Participants Did Not Make Progress or Complete Goals

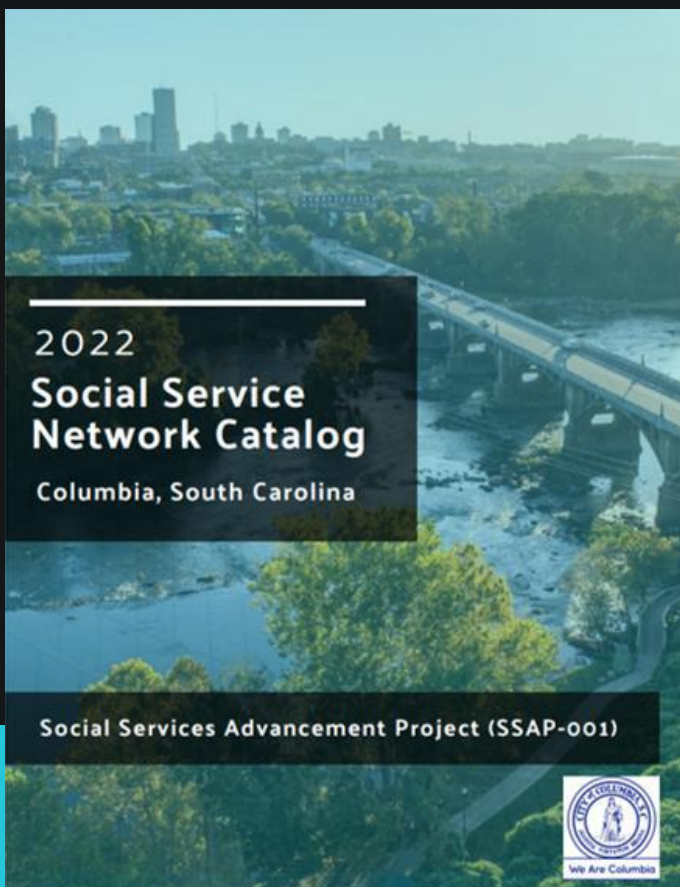
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250+ Hours - Working with 20 individuals who were experiencing homelessness. BPS assessments conducted to develop data connections and variables across participants.

90+ Hours - Dedicated to data analysis, development, cross collaboration. Data correlated connections to housing first models, support for biopsychosocial assessment, and case navigation.

Social Services Advancement Project

The City of Columbia Task Force to Prevent and End Homelessness partnered with Inspire Real Change in April 2022 to develop and drive solutions to reduce and end homelessness in Columbia, South Carolina. With this partnership, the Social Services Advancement Project (SSAP-001) was created to identify current programs/services, assess Social Service community integration, and initiate efficiencies/solutions to reduce homelessness.



158 Hours - Dedicated to the development and publishing of the Social Service Network Catalog. This interactive catalog contains information on 100+ homeless programs and related services in Richland County, SC.

324 Hours - Conducting a social service assessment to identify service gaps and drive solutions to reduce homelessness.

The Social Service Network Catalog Established a New Baseline for Information and Collaboration. The Social Service Assessment Produced Six Observations, Nine Recommendations, and Six Solution-Focused Models.

Community Connections Project

The Community Connections Project engaged unsheltered citizens in Richland County, South Carolina. Our community outreach team engaged homeless/unsheltered individuals, provide health/hygiene items, and conducted on-site needs assessments. Utilizing information from the assessment, the individual's needs were prioritized to produce person-centered plans. Unsheltered citizens were then connected with health programs/housing services to fill their needs and support homeless recovery.



The Community Connections Project Engaged Twenty-Four Individuals Experiencing Homelessness. Assessments were Conducted and Plans Produced Based on Needs. All Participants were Directed/Supported to Services to Fill Individual Needs, which Promotes Homeless Recovery.
