

Billie Wade's daughter Ramona, and her friend Marlene will be leaving the first week of May, to head to Prescott to donate quilts. Marlene told me what an influence Billie had been to her, over her life, teaching and encouraging her to sew, and giving her, her first sewing machine. Billie grew up on a ranch on the valley floor, below Jerome, Arizona. Serving in the military, herself, Billie developed a love for veterans, and the VA home in Prescott Arizona in particular, because she felt that this home did not receive as much support as others because of its location. Those of us in the guild who remember Billie, remember her as a character - kind, funny, outspoken and always willing to enthusiastically help with a project.

Now on the subject of recycling- it's sad that we can't recycle fabric like we used to. But, here is an idea of how to use up just about all your fabric scraps. And this quilt is really scrappy and quick!
