The retreat at beautiful Vina de Lestonnac in Temecula begins Thursday, Sept. 2 at 4:30 pm and concludes Sunday Sept. 5 after brunch around 12:30. The total cost for a double room is \$350. Deposits of \$100 will be taken at the guild's pop up May 22 or you can mail your deposit to Pat Gailband. The second payment of \$100 will be due in June and the balance of \$150 is due in July. The retreat center is not offering triple rooms and we will be limited to 20 or less attendees. All attendees must be fully vaccinated to insure all our members' health. The center will be practicing CDC guidelines as well. Masks are required in certain situations but not in the sewing room among our group of quilters.

Please bring: scissors, rotary cutter & mat (I will have a few available), ruler, and strip cutter (shape cutter) if you have it, and a sack lunch – and wear your mask for while we are inside.

Saturday - May 22, 10-Noon - Philanthropy quilts will be accepted, philanthropy kits will be available, and scrap fabric will be collected for recycling. If you need batting for a philanthropy quilt, email me and let me know.

I am overwhelmed....!!!! I received 20 philanthropy quilts from Kathryn Diamond's quilting group – they are just lovely (you saw many of them when Kathryn gave the program a couple months ago). All of them were quilted on domestic sewing machines!!! They are truly an inspiration.

T. I. P. S.* for MAY 2021

Did you hear Kathryn Diamond's talk about quilting on a domestic machine at our March meeting? Her talk was great. Are you inspired, but unsure you can do it? Do you have several quilt tops ready to be quilted, and are wondering what your next step

should be? Kathryn recommended spray basting your quilt top to the batting and backing (to make your quilt sandwich) - instead of pinning. There are several ways to do this, but Patsy Thompson has a wonderful tutorial on this, answering all the questions you will have. Check this out: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=nwV8tUkhxUM

After you have sandwiched your quilt together its time to quilt!!! Have you wished that you had a large quilting table to support your quilt? Sew Steady makes an acrylic shelf, custom made to the outline of your machine. (<u>https://www.sewsteady.com/product-category/sewing-tables-insets-inserts/</u>)

Another idea is from Marguerita McManus who shows you how to make a quilting surface out of insulation foamboard from Home Depot, which can be very large, then stored in a closet out of the way when you are done. She uses one of those folding plastic tables to put the foam insulation board on, and clear vinyl for a slick surface. It makes a wonderful area for you to quilt with your domestic sewing machine. Intrigued? You got-a check this out! And be sure to watch all three tutorials that Marguerita has, as in the 2nd and 3rd videos she gives some updates and improvements on her design.
