

The SMUGGLE Principles

Last month our speaker was Karen Brow-Meier. Your newsletter editor missed this little bit last month, submitted by Peggy and written by Karen Brow-Meier. The editor wanted everyone to see it!

Here are Six design elements which make a quilt sing!

S- slight asymmetry

M- movement

U- unexpected technique

G- gentle humor

G- graceful disruption of edges/borders

L- something lovable

E- elegant details

AUGUST 2022 PHILANTHROPY

Whew! August is here and it sure is hot! I'm not using any quilts right now - but I am getting ready for our Philanthropy Sew-in in September. My goal is to have 80 placemat kits ready at our September 21st meeting - one or two for each of you! I have been cutting strips for the last couple of days to get ready. I have 800 Christmas fabric strips cut....now I am working on making sure I have 560 non-Christmas fabric strips for the other side of the placemat. And, thanks to Diane, I think I have enough already cut. I'm going to sit in front of the telly tonight and count them.

Next, I have to cut 5,920 inches of strips for binding, then cut it into 74-inch pieces, and press double. This is all so you will have all the material at hand to sew your placemat.

All this work just needs YOU! (sort of like Uncle Sam - visualize me dressed as Uncle Sam, pointing at you).

So......Please plan to bring your sewing machine to our September meeting, so we can sew together. Hmm,....there might even be a prize for the person who completes the first placemat at the meeting ©

I can hear our new members saying "What on earth is she talking about". WHAT AM I TALKING ABOUT? For you new members, each fall our guild has been sewing placemats and donating them to Meals-On-Wheels; they are used as Christmas gifts for all the clients they deliver meals to.

ANIMAL PRINT CHALLENGE DEADLINE CHANGE

The deadline for the Animal Print Challenge has been moved back to our November meeting. This is due to having a speaker in October and also the fact that we will be drawing the winner of the opportunity quilt at that meeting. The drop-off date will be announced at a later date. It will be about one week prior to the November meeting.

The guidelines for the challenge remain the same.

- 1. One or more animal print fabrics (50 square inches or more) must appear on the front of the quilt.
- 2. The size of the quilt may not exceed 200" around the perimeter/outside edge of the quilt.
- 3. You are free to use the technique/s of your choice, but be sure to include one or more animal prints, not just a pieced or appliquéd animal.
- 4. The piece must be quilted.

Note: "Animal print fabrics" is meant to include not only fabric printed with animals on it, but also fabrics that imitate the pattern of an animal's skin or coat. This includes feathers, scales, fur, etc.
