


My plants need rain; I pray for it. Other states are overcome with rain; I pray for some of it to come here.

These placemats are used as Christmas gifts for shut-ins that Meals-on-Wheels provide meals for. The placemat you make may be the only Christmas gift that some lonely senior receives this year. There is a gift tag provided with each kit, so you can write a short message to the recipient.

Sept 21 - What to bring:

- 1. sewing machine & thread (red or green if you have it for the binding is nice).
- 2. scissors, pins & ruler
- 3. extension cord if you have one
- 4. Ruler (a cutting table with mats, and some rulers will be provided)

What is provided:

- 1. placemat kit with all fabric materials,
- 2. ironing board
- 3. cutting mats

We will sew until 3:30 PM - it will be like a mini retreat!



Minutes from August 17, 2022 Kaleidoscope Quilt Guild General Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 1 PM by Peggy. Membership person Cindy reported that we have 5 guests and 3 new members today.

Treasurer Diane reported that as of July 1,2022, our balance was \$18,335.62. Our income for the month was \$2,380.00- mostly incoming money for the retreat. Expenses for the month were \$551.25. Balance as of July 31, 2022 was \$20,164.40. A bunch of that money will be paid for the retreat in Sept.
