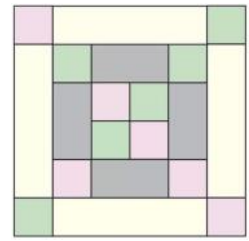
11/20 – General meeting This month's will be a member spotlight. Our member presenting will be Linda Fox. We are looking forward to learning a little more about Linda's quilting journey!

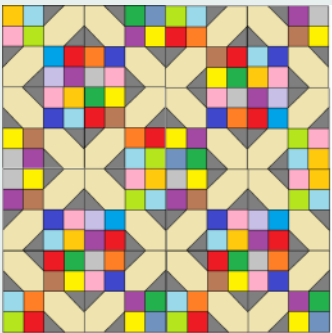

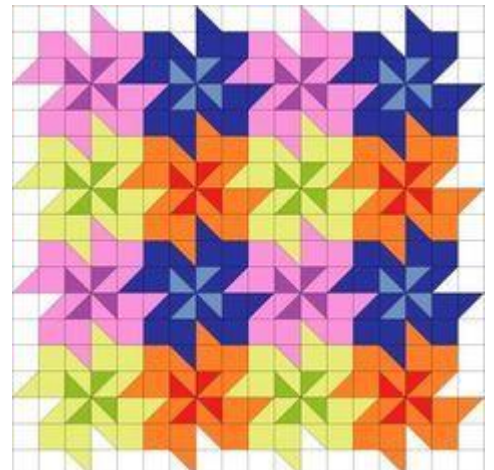

We got mail!!! We received a thank you letter recently from the Northern Arizona VA in Prescott Arizona:

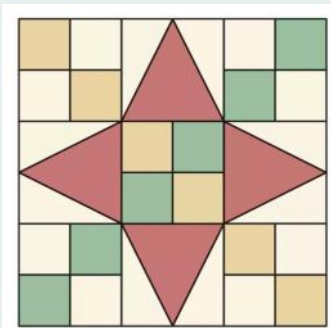

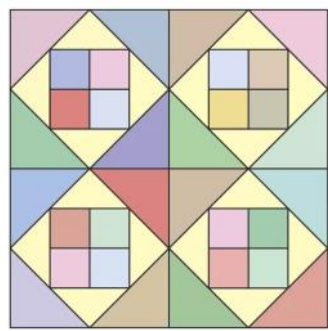
OCTOBER'S PROGRAM IS OUR PHILANTHROPY SEW-IN

They serve meals to many shut-ins, some of whom have no family support. When the Meals-on-Wheels volunteer delivers a meal to them during the Christmas season, the placemat is a special gift of love – letting these lonely folks know that they are remembered.

Each placemat has Christmas fabric on one side, and non-holiday fabric on the other – so it can be used all year. To personalize the gift, a card is pinned to each placemat, letting the recipient know that it is from Kaleidoscope Quilt Guild, and the person who made it signs their (first) name.

This is always a fun meeting, lots of talk, laughter, and placemats! I hope you will look forward to bringing your sewing machine to this meeting and joining all the fun.

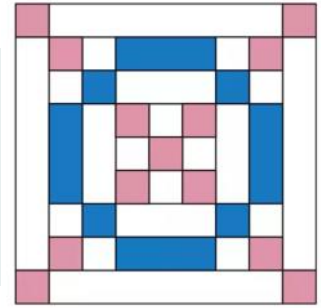

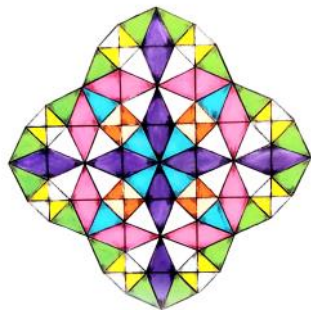

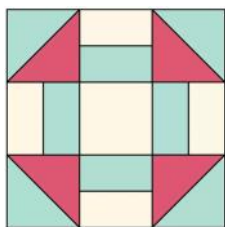
